This day had Audience of The QUEEN:

His Excellency Doctor Witold Rodzinski, to present the Letters of Recall of his predecessor Monsieur Eugeniusz Milnikiel, and his own Letters of Credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Republic of Poland.

The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 4th instant, to confer the dignity of a Barony of the United Kingdom upon Basil Sanderson, Esquire, M.C., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of BARON SANDERSON OF AYOT, of Welwyn in the County of Hertford.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parishes of Christ Church, St. Aldates, Holy Trinity, St. Frideswide, St. Matthew, St. Peter, St. Ebbe and St. Thomas, in the city of Oxford, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the St. Mary's Cemetery, Osney, Oxford:

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Cemetery, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Cemetery, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 19th day of August next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before the said 19th day of August.
