The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the British Empire Medal (Civil Division) to the undermentioned:

Ronald Gordon SCHMIDT, Mechanical Foreman,
Nkana, Northern Rhodesia.

Mr. Schmidt went to the rear of the house next to his own in Nkana Kitwe to investigate a disturbance. He was told that a man, armed with a large knife, had stabbed a police officer. He returned to his own house and armed himself with a pick handle and a short piece of wood and again went to the scene of the disturbance where he found a man struggling with two police officers. He immediately went to their assistance and took part in the subsequent efforts to arrest the armed man. He saw one of the police officers wounded, but this did not deter him and despite receiving a deep stab himself he continued his efforts. It is doubtful if an arrest would have been made at that time but for his help.
