By our last Accounts from Valentia, the Earl of Peterborow was marched from thence with a Body of about 8900 Horse and Foot, to attack the Conde de las Torres, who not being above 3 or 4000 strong, thought fit to retire, but lest his Bagage, and that of his Olincers, a Prey to the Confederate Forces. The Marshal de Tesse was marching to join the Conde. The Chevalier d'Asseld, who commands a Body of French Troops in Arragon, has possessed himself of some open Towns, parricularly of Mouson; but the Castle of that Place, wherem is a Garison of the King of Spain's Forces, makes a vigorous Desence.
