The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 2nd instant, to confer the dignity of a Viscounty of the United Kingdom upon the Right Honourable Antony Henry Head, C.B.E., M.C., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of VISCOUNT HEAD, of Throope in the County of Wilts.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council  
Whereas the Church Commissioners have duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 24th day of May 1960, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

#### "SCHEME

relating to Numbers 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 College Precincts, Numbers 1, 2, 3 and 5 College Yard and Numbers 1 and 32 Deansway, Worcester

"We, the Church Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868' Section 3, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Worcester:

"Whereas under and by virtue of an Order in Council of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, bearing date the 29th day of November 1859, and duly published in the *London Gazette* of the 16th day of the

following month, there is now payable by us to the Dean and Chapter of Worcester the annual sum of £9,000 and the further sum of £360 (such last mentioned sum to be by them appropriated and paid to the Chapter Clerk for the time being) until the said Dean and Chapter shall have been put into possession, in fee simple, of real estates sufficient to secure to them a clear annual income therefrom (after deducting rates, taxes and other outgoings, including costs of management) of £9,000:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter have not yet been so put into possession of such real estates in substitution for the said annual sum of £9,000, and the said further sum of £360, but the said annual sums continue payable by us under the provisions of the said Order in Council:

"And whereas there are situate in Worcester certain premises known respectively as Numbers 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, College Precincts, Numbers 1, 2, 3 and 5 College Yard, Numbers 1 and 32 Deansway, which said premises are shown upon the tracing annexed hereto and are coloured red thereon:

"And whereas it is desirable that the premises aforesaid should be in the ownership of the said Dean and Chapter and they have applied to us and we have agreed to transfer to them our interest therein in consideration of the reduction by the sum of £645 of the annual sum of £9,000 aforesaid:

"And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Worcester, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Mervyn, Lord Bishop of Worcester, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter, testified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals, that upon and from the publication in the *London Gazette* of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any further conveyance or act in the law, the premises known as Numbers 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 College Precincts, Numbers 1, 2, 3, and 5 College Yard and Numbers 1 and 32 Deansway, coloured red upon the said tracing annexed hereto, with their appurtenances, shall, subject always to the liabilities and charges, if any, to which the said property may now be specifically liable, be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act, and that they shall be entitled to the rents, profits and proceeds of the said premises as from the 25th day of December in the year 1959, and that in consideration of such transfer as aforesaid the payment of the said annual sum of £9,000 shall be reduced by the sum of £645 as from the said 25th day of December in the year 1959, but that the additional annual payment of £360 shall continue to be paid as heretofore:
