

## HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

## ASHINGTON URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

*The Ashington Urban District Council (Whitefield Farm) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960*

On the 21st day of July 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public right of way over land situate at Whitefield Farm, Ashington, being approximately 400 yards in length and of undefined width and shown coloured blue on the map contained in the Order and marked "A" and "B" thereon, and to divert such right of way over land situate at Whitefield Farm, Ashington, along a line shown coloured red on the said map and marked "C", "D" and "E" thereon, for approximately 470 yards in length and 3 feet or more in width, so as to join up with the existing right of way, such extinguishment and diversion to become effective as from the 12th day of August 1960.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Ashington, Northumberland, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd day of August 1960, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

## EXETER CITY COUNCIL

## ISLE OF WIGHT COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Isle of Wight County Council (Compton Bay) Public Path Diversion Order No. 1, 1960*

On the 21st day of July 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way at Compton Bay running from Road A.3055 south-west for a distance of 260 feet to a line running from road A.3055 south-west for a distance of 315 feet and thence west for a distance of 90 feet.

The old path closes with effect from the 12th August 1960.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it is being deposited at the County Hall (Room 31), County Hall, Newport, I.W., and may

be inspected, free of charge, during the usual office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 12th day of August 1960, but if any person is aggrieved by the Order or disposed to question the authority thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made therein has not been complied with, in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make an application to the High Court.
