Diversion Order, 1959*

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th day of July 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed (with modifications) the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to extinguish (at the expiration of twenty-one days from the date of confirmation of the Order) the public right of way from the public road A419 at Cricklade for a distance of approximately 328 yards and to create a new footpath 4 feet in width from the said public road A419 at Cricklade for a distance of approximately 204 yards.

A certified copy of the Order and of the map contained in the Order as confirmed by the Minister has been deposited at the Council Offices, Manor House, Wootton Bassett, and will be open for inspection free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. (Saturdays 9 a.m. to 12 noon.)

The Order becomes operative as from the 19th day of August 1960, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF

*The Hornchurch Urban District (St. George's  
Hospital) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960*

On the 28th day of July 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.
