

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

CITY OF PORTSMOUTH

Notice is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Portsmouth, acting by the Council as the Highway Authority for the said City, intend to make an application to the Magistrates' Court for the said City to be holden at the Law Courts, Hyde Park Road, Portsmouth, at 10.30 a.m., on the 13th day of September 1960, for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1949, for the closing of a portion of the highway known as Old Rope Walk, Portsmouth, as being unnecessary. The portion of the highway to be closed commences at a point approximately 195 ft. south of its junction with Greatham Street and extends in a southerly direction for approximately 305 ft., and has an average width of 6 ft. It is shown coloured pink on the plan deposited at the offices of the Council at the Guildhall, Portsmouth, where it is open for inspection free of charge during normal office hours.

And notice is hereby further given that any person to whom notice has been given or any person who uses the said highway or any other person who will be aggrieved by the making of the said Order shall have the right to be heard at the hearing of the said application.

SWAFFHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Swaffham Rural District Council (North Pickenham & Ashill) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1960.

SWAFFHAM RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Swaffham Rural District Council (North Pickenham) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960

The above Order made on the 4th day of August 1960 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert part of the public footpath which runs in a southerly direction from the entrance of Houghton Common in the north-west corner thereof to a line running from the said entrance to Houghton Common and thence parallel with the fence along the north-west and west and south-west boundaries of the said common to the south-west corner thereof. The length of the part of the existing footpath to be extinguished is 317 yards and the length of the new footpath is 355 yards.

GLAMORGAN RIVER BOARD

Byelaws

Notice is hereby given that the Glamorgan River Board intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice for the confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of a Byelaw made by the Board for securing the efficient discharge of their functions. The proposed Byelaw relates to the prohibition of use of instruments other than rod and line for the taking of salmon and trout in the Rivers Rhymney, Taff, Ely, Thaw, Ogmere, Kenfig, Afan and Neath and the estuaries of the said rivers. During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice a printed copy of the said Byelaw will be deposited at the offices of the Board (as under) and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any weekday during the usual office hours. During the same period printed copies of the Byelaw will be supplied on demand free of charge to any person appearing to the Board to be interested.
