

Highways Act, 1959
Stretham By-Pass

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act, providing that a By-pass which he proposes to construct at Stretham in the County of the Isle of Ely shall become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation and that the length of the London—Cambridge—King's Lynn Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road on 1st April next after the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Isle of Ely County Council (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the said By-pass is opened for through traffic.

Copies of the draft Order and of the relevant plan may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 12th August 1960, to 12th November 1960, at the offices of the Ministry of Transport, 21-37 Hereford Road, London W.2; the Isle of Ely C.C., County Hall, March, Cambs; the Isle of Ely C.C. Depot, Downham Road, Ely and the Divisional Road Engineer, Palace Chambers, Silver Street, Bedford.

Any person may within three months from 12th August 1960, object to the making of the Order by

notice to the Minister quoting HT. 41/1/03 and stating the grounds of objection.
