HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

ABERTULLERY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

Abertillery Urban District Council (Jukes Level Crossing) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960

On the 3rd day of August 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from Morley Road to Abertillery Park where the same crosses the main railway line from the line "A.B." to the line "C.D." on the map annexed to the Order.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Abertillery, Mon., between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and between 2.30 p.m. and 5 p.m. on any day from Monday to Friday inclusive.

The Order becomes operative as from the 25th day of August 1960, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

URBAN DISTRICT OF PORTISHEAD,

DEE AND CLWYD RIVER BOARD

RIVER BOARDS ACT, 1948

Rivers (Prevention of Pollution) Act, 1951

Notice is hereby given that the Dee and Clwyd River Board intend, at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of the publication of this notice, to apply to the Minister of Housing and Local Government and the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food for confirmation of Byelaws made by the Board for securing the efficient discharge of their functions. The proposed Byelaws relate to the following matters:

- (a) the prohibition of the deposit in streams of litter or rubbish;
- (b) the prohibition of the washing or cleansing in streams of certain things;
- (c) the prohibition of the use in vessels of sanitary appliances from which polluting matter can pass into a stream.

During a period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice, a copy of the said Byelaws will be deposited at the offices of the Board, 2 Vicar's Lane, Chester, and will be open to public inspection, without charge, on any weekday during the usual office hours. During the same period, copies of the Byelaws will be supplied on demand free of charge to any person appearing to the Board to be interested. Any objection to the confirmation of the Byelaws should be made in writing and addressed to the Welsh Secretary, Welsh Office, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Cathays Park, Cardiff, and should be received at that office before the expiration of the period of deposit of the Byelaws. A copy of the objection should at the same time be sent to the Executive Officer and Clerk of the Dee and Clwyd River Board at the address given below.
