The Queen has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 22nd instant, to confer the dignity of a Barony of the United Kingdom upon Lieutenant-Colonel Sir Terence Edmund Gascoigne Nugent, G.C.V.O., M.C., and the heirs male of his body lawfully begotten, by the name, style and title of Baron Nugent, of West Harling in the County of Norfolk.

PRESENT.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 26th day of July 1960 (N.C.W. 323/16/60/B.) in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being

or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council;

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the nineteenth day of December 1956, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to approve the introduction of Supplementary Lists of Officers;

"And whereas the general conditions of service for officers entered into the Supplementary Lists are set out in Schedule I of Order in Council dated the fifteenth day of February 1957;

"And whereas we consider it necessary now to form a Supplementary List of officers entered for seamanship duties;

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve the introduction of a Supplementary List of seaman officers with the conditions of service set out in the annexed Scheduse;

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

"SCHEDULE

"Conditions of Service for the Supplementary List of Officers entered for seamonship duties

"General conditions of service to be in accordance with Sichedule I to Order in Council dated 15th February 1957;

"2. Initial engagement to be for a period of 10 years from date of first appointment; the officer to have, however, the option of withdrawal on completion of 5 years' service. Voluntary withdrawal at other times to be permitted at Admiralty discretion.

"3. Officers other than those transferred to permanent commissions to be placed on the Emergency List for four years following the termination of their active service.

"4. Officers to be entered as Cadet (S.L.); promotion to the ranks of Midshipman (S.L.), acting Sub-Lieutenant (S.L.), Sub-Lieutenant (S.L.), and Lieutenant (S.L.) to be on recommendation in accordance with regulations to be prescribed by the Admiralty.

"5. Promotion to the rank of Lieutenant Commander (S.L.) to be by selection at not less than 8 years' seniority as Lieutenant. Promotion to the rank of Commander (S.L.), to be by selection within zones to be laid down by the Admiralty.

"6. Officers to be elligible for consideration for transfer to permanent commissions on the Supplementary List at the discretion of the Admiralty, but subject in any event to the prior completion of more than five years' service on the engagement mentioned in Clause 2 above.
