

“Gratuities for officers not granted permanent commissions

Per cent.

“7. Officers transferred to the Emergency List on completing a full engagement of 5 or 10 years, as the case may be, to be eligible for gratuity at such rates as may from time to time be laid down by Order in Council.

“8. Officers invalidated on account of disability not due to causes within their own control to be eligible for gratuity at the full rates payable in accordance with Clause 7 above, proportionate to their length of service.

“9. Officers released from the Active List at any other time, for reasons other than invalidating as provided in Clause 8, at Admiralty discretion, to be allowed such gratuity as may be determined in accordance with the general conditions laid down from time to time, by Order in Council, for awards in such circumstances.”

Her Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Public Works Loans Act, 1897 (60 and 61 Vict. c. 51) as amended by the Public Works Loans Act, 1917 (7 and 8 Geo. 5 c. 32), the Public Works Loans Act, 1918 (8 and 9 Geo. 5 c. 27), and the Housing (Financial Provisions) Act, 1958 (6 and 7 Eliz. 2 c. 42) they have directed by their Minute of 17th August 1960, that on loans advanced otherwise than on the security of local rates from the Local Loans Fund, on and after the 20th August 1960, there shall be chargeable in lieu of the rates fixed by the Treasury Minute of the 14th July 1960, the following rates of interest:
