Liskeard Rural District Council, Lanreath Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1960

The above Order made on the 1st day of November 1960, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way on foot over land situate at Trefrawl in the Parish of Lanreath running north-westwards from point "A" situate at Tregunnick in the south of field Ordnance Survey Number 1239 for a distance of approximately 1,940 feet through fields Ordnance Survey Numbers 1239, 1250 and 1238 to point "B" situate at a point in the highway approximately midway between Trefrawl and Bogga Mill in the north-westerly corner of the field being Ordnance Survey Number 1238.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Luxstowe House, Liskeard, and at the office of the Clerk of the Lanreath Parish Council, Penadlake, Lanreath, on any weekday during the usual office hours.

ROSS AND WHITCHURCH RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Ross and Whitchurch Rural District Council—Vine Tree Farm, Ross-on-Wye Public Path Diversion Order, 1960.

The above Order made on the 15th day of November 1960, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running from a point on the Western boundary of Field O.S.8 where it meets the Northern boundary of field O.S.368 in a south-westerly direction to a stile on the main Ross/Walford Road in the south-western corner of field O.S.291 to a line running from a point on the Western boundary of field O.S.8 where it meets the Northern boundary of field O.S.368 along the Northern boundary of field O.S.368 in a Westerly direction to a farm gate on the main Ross/Walford Road in the north-western corner of field O.S.368.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF COOKHAM

Cookham Rural District Council Public Path (No. 2 Cookham) Diversion Order, 1960

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th day of November 1960, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to divert the public right of way over land adjoining High Road, Cookham Rise, in the parish of Cookham, commencing at point "A" on the map contained in the Order and proceeding in a westerly direction to point "B" on the said map to the position commencing at point "A" on the said map and proceeding in a southerly direction to point "C" thereon and thence in a south-westerly direction to point "B" on the map aforesaid. The existing public right of way between the points marked "A"—"B" on the map will be closed as from the 12th December 1960.

The Order becomes operative as from the 18th day of November, 1960 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice make application to the High Court.

CRAWLEY URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Crawley Urban District (Three Bridges) (No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960
