The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under sections 3 (6) and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:—The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 41) Order, 1960.

The First Schedule to the Order provides for the exemption from import duty from 1st December 1960, until 1st October 1961, or to such other date as is shown in the Order, of certain goods (mainly chemicals) which are at present liable to import duty.

The Second Schedule to the Order provides for the continued exemption until 1st October 1961, or to such other date as is shown in the Order, of certain goods (mainly chemicals and iron and steel goods) which are at present temporarily exempt from duty.

The Order comes into operation on 1st December 1960, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1960, No. 2163.
