PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865 (28 & 29 Vict. c. 73), it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend certain Orders in Council concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants for officers, nurses and ratings disabled, and for the widows and children of officers and ratings deceased, in consequence of service during the 1914 World War:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—

- (1) "the 1920 Order" means the Order in Council of the 11th June 1920 (S.R. & O. 1920/1021 (II, p. 295)), relating to seamen and marines, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council;
- (2) "the 1921 (Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921/360 (p. 770)), relating to commissioned and subordinate officers and nurses, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council;
- (3) "the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order" means the Order in Council of the 9th March, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921/361 (p. 794)), relating to Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank and Warrant Officers, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council;
- (4) "the 1949 Order" means the Order in Council of the 29th September 1949, as amended by any subsequent Order in Council.

2. In Article 6a of the 1920 Order as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled ratings (for the words "disabled in the highest degree" there shall be substituted the words and

figures "the degree of whose disablement is not less than 80 per cent." and for the figures 35s. and 70s. there shall be substituted the figures 40s. and 80s.

3. In column 2 of the Table in Article 11 of the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of pension which may be awarded to widows of ratings) for the figures 71s., 70s., 69s., 68s., 67s. and 66s. there shall be substituted the figures 81s., 80s., 79s., 78s., 77s. and 76s. respectively.

4. In Article 12 of the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for the children of ratings' widows) for the figures 25s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 29s.

5. In Article 18 (1) of the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to certain ratings' children who have attained the age of 18 years and are incapable of self-support) for the figures 50s. there shall be substituted the figures 57s. 6d.

6. For the First Schedule to the 1920 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the assessments of disablement caused by specified injuries and of certain other disablements and the pensions which may be granted to ratings for such injuries and disablements) there shall be substituted the First Schedule to this Order.

7. In Article 7 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled officers) for the words "the highest degree" there shall be substituted the words and figures "a degree of not less than 80 per cent." and for the figures £100 and 70s. there shall be substituted the figures £104 and 80s. respectively.

8. In Article 12 (1 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances to widows of officers in respect of children) for the figures £73 there shall be substituted the figures £83 10s.

9. In Article 17 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to certain officers' children who have attained the age of 18 years and are incapable of self-support) for the figures £130 there shall be substituted the figures £149 10s.

10. In Article 27 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled nurses) for the words "disabled in the highest degree" there shall be substituted

the words and figures "the degree of whose disablement is not less than 80 per cent," and for the figures 70s. there shall be substituted the figures 80s.

11. For Part I of the First Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled officers) there shall be substituted the Second Schedule to this Order.

12. For the figures in columns (2) to (5) in the Second Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of pension for officers' widows) there shall be substituted the figures in the following columns:

13. For the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of pension for disabled nurses) there shall be substituted the Third Schedule to this Order.

14. In Article 7 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled officers) for the words "the highest degree" there shall be substituted the words and figures "a degree of not less than 80 per cent." and for the figures 70s. there shall be substituted the figures 80s.

15. In Article 12 (1) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances to widows of officers in respect of children) for the figures £67 there shall be substituted the figures £77 10s.

16. In Article 17 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to certain officers' children who have attained the age of 18 years and are incapable of self-support) for the figures £130 there shall be substituted the figures £149 10s.

17. For the First Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of retired pay for disabled officers) there shall be substituted the Fourth Schedule to this Order.

18. In column (2) of the Table in the Third Schedule to the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of pension for widows of officers) for the figures £232 and £207 there shall be substituted the figures £258 and £233 respectively.

19. In Article (1) of the 1949 Order (which contains definitions) after paragraph (8) there shall be inserted the following paragraph:

"(8A) "apprentice" means a person undergoing full-time training for any trade, business, profession, office, employment or vocation, and not in receipt of earnings which provide him, wholly or substantially, with a livelihood:—"

20. In subparagraph (a) of paragraph (2) of Article 4 of the 1949 Order (which provides for allowances in respect of children of disabled officers and ratings) the words "receiving not more than nominal wages" shall be deleted.

21. In Article 5 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the supplementation of retired pay or pension and the award of allowances for unemployable pensioners)—

(a) in paragraph (2), for the figures £143 and 55s. there shall be substituted the figures £164 and 63s. respectively;

(b) in paragraph (3) (b), for the figures £42 and 20s. there shall be substituted the figures £55 and 25s. respectively;

(c) in paragraph (3) (c), for the figures £78 and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures £91 and 35s. respectively;

(d) for subparagraph (e) of paragraph (3) there shall be substituted the following subparagraph:

"(e) Where an allowance has been awarded under Article 4 of this Order or under subparagraph (d) of this paragraph in respect of the child or children of an officer, the rate thereof in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children may be increased to £45 10s. a year, and where an allowance has been so awarded in respect of the child or children of a rating, the rate thereof in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children may be increased to 17s. 6d. a week and in respect of each other of those children to 9s. 6d. a week."

22. For subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of Article 5A of the 1949 Order (see Order of 24th January 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for comforts) there shall be substituted the following subparagraph:

"(a) at the rate of £52 a year in the case of an officer or nurse or 20s. a week in the case of a rating where the officer, nurse or rating as the case may be is in receipt of an allowance for constant attendance and is—

(i) in receipt of an allowance under Article 5 of this Order; or

(ii) in receipt of retired pay or pension in respect of disablement the degree of which is 100 per cent. and which has been awarded in respect of multiple injuries which, in the opinion of the Minister, render his disablement so severe as to justify the award of an allowance at the aforementioned rate;"

23. In Article 6 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for lowered standard of occupation) for the figures 34s. there shall be substituted the figures 39s.

24. In Article 7 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of personal and additional allowances for disabled officers and nurses during periods of approved treatment)—

(a) in paragraph (1), for the figures 50s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 57s. 6d.;

(b) in paragraph (4), for the figures £42, £39 and £78 there shall be substituted the figures £55, £45 10s. and £91 respectively.

25. In Article 8 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Orders of 31st May 1951 and 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for disabled ratings receiving approved treatment)—

(a) in subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1), for the word "and", where the same first appears, there shall be substituted the words and figures "or, subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) of the proviso to Article 11A of this Order, under the Article or";

(b) in paragraph (2), for the figures 85s. there shall be substituted the figures 97s. 6d.;

(c) in paragraph (3), for the figures 50s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 57s. 6d.;

(d) in paragraph (4), for the figures 20s., 15s. and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures 25s., 17s. 6d. and 35s. respectively, and to the proviso to subparagraph (b) there shall be added the words and figures "and for each other child to 9s. 6d. a week";

(e) in paragraph (7), for the figures 101s. 8d., 95s., 91s. 8d., 88s. 4d. and 85s. there shall be substituted the figures 114s. 2d., 107s. 6d., 104s. 2d., 100s. 10d. and 97s. 6d. respectively.

26. In Article 110 of the 1949 Order, (which provides for the award in certain cases of allowances for part-time treatment) for the words and figures "Article 5 (2), 5A, 12 (12A) (1) or 19" in the proviso, as amended (Order of 24th January 1957), there shall be substituted the words and figures "Articles 5 (2), 5A, 11A, 12, 12A (1) or 19".

27. After Article 111 of the 1949 Warrant there shall be inserted the following Article:

"11A. *Severe disablement occupational allowance.*
—Where an officer, nurse or rating is in receipt of an allowance for constant attendance at a rate increased under the proviso to Article 7 or 27 of the 1921 (Officers) Order, Article 7 of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or Article 6A of the 1920 Order or would be in receipt of such an allowance if he were not in a hospital or other institution, he may for any period during which he is, in the opinion of the Minister, ordinarily employed in a gainful occupation, be awarded an allowance at the rate of £52 a year in the case of an officer or nurse, or 20s. a week in any other case:

Provided that no allowance shall be payable under this Article to a person for any period in respect of which he—

- (a) is eligible for an award under Article 5 (2) of this Order; or
- (b) is in receipt of any such benefit as is mentioned in paragraph (7) of Article 7 of this Order or retired pay or pension increased under that Article or an allowance increased under paragraph (3) of Article 8 of this Order."

28. In Article 12 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 5th January 1955), (which provides for the award of allowances for wear and tear of clothing) for the figure £6 there shall be substituted the figures £7 10s. and for the figures £10, wherever the same appear, the figures £12 10s.

29. In paragraph (1) of Article 13 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which sets out the rates of pension which may be awarded to ratings for 100 per cent. disablement) for the figures 101s. 8d., 95s., 91s. 8d., 88s. 4d. and 85s. there shall be substituted the figures 114s. 2d., 107s. 6d., 104s. 2d., 100s. 10d. and 97s. 6d. respectively.

30. In Article 14 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for awards to widows and children on the death of officers or ratings on or after the 3rd September 1939)—

- (a) in the proviso to paragraph (2), in paragraph (c) for the figures £112 10s., £88, £104 10s., 30s. and 40s. there shall be substituted the figures £128 10s., £100, £120 10s., 34s. 6d. and 46s. respectively and in paragraph (d) the words "receiving not more than nominal wages" shall be deleted;
- (b) in paragraph (3), for the figures £130 and 50s. there shall be substituted the figures £149 10s. and 57s. 6d. respectively.

31. In Article 15 of the 1949 Order, as amended (Order of 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to children of officers and ratings who died before the 3rd September 1939)—

- (a) in paragraph (1), for the figures £73 and £67 there shall be substituted the figures £83 10s. and £77 10s. respectively;
- (b) in paragraph (2), for the figures £112 10s., £88 and £104 10s. there shall be substituted the figures £128 10s., £100 and £120 10s. respectively;
- (c) in paragraph (3), for the figures 25s. there shall be substituted the figures 29s.;
- (d) in paragraph (4), for the figures 30s. and 40s. there shall be substituted the figures 34s. 6d. and 46s. respectively;
- (e) in subparagraph (a) of paragraph (5), the words "receiving not more than nominal wages" shall be deleted;
- (f) in paragraph (6), for the figures £130 and 50s. there shall be substituted the figures £149 10s. and 57s. 6d. respectively.

32. In Article 19 of the 1949 Order (which provides for the award of education allowances in respect of children of disabled or deceased officers or ratings) for the figures £80 there shall be substituted the figures £120.

33. For Article 20 of the 1949 Order there shall be substituted the following Article:

"20. *Rent allowances to widows who have children.*

(1) Where the widow of a commissioned officer, warrant officer or rating is in receipt of a pension under Article 11, 16A, 16B or 17A of the 1921 (Officers) Order or under Article 11, 16A, 16B or 17A of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order or under Article 11, 17A or 17B of the 1920 Order, as the case may be, or under Article 14 of this Order, and her household includes a child, the widow may be awarded an allowance in accordance with the following provisions of this Article at such weekly rate not exceeding 29s. as the Minister may consider appropriate having regard to the amount by which her weekly rent and rates exceed 6s.

(2) Where the child has attained the child's age limit, the award of an allowance under this Article shall not be made or continued unless the circumstances of the case are, in the opinion of the Minister, such as to justify the award or its continuance.

(3) Where an allowance under this Article would cease by reason of the death of a child before attaining the child's age limit the allowance shall be continued for the period of thirteen weeks from the date of the child's death.

(4) In this Article—

- (a) "child" includes any child who should, in the opinion of the Minister, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the officer or rating and the other circumstances of the case, be treated as covered by the provisions of this Article, being a child who has not attained the child's age limit or who, having attained that age limit, fulfils any one of the conditions set out in subparagraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph (d) of the proviso to paragraph (2) of Article 14 of this Order for the grant or continuance of a child's allowance;
- (b) "weekly rent and rates" means such sum as the Minister may, after taking into account all relevant factors and making all necessary apportionments, consider to be the weekly amount which the widow is paying or providing either directly or indirectly in respect of rent, or the equivalent thereof, and rates for accommodation for the benefit of herself and the child;
- (c) "child's age limit" means in relation to the child of an officer, the age of 18 years and in relation to the child of a rating the age of 16 years;
- (d) "accommodation" means living accommodation without any service or benefit not ordinarily provided by the landlord to the tenant of an unfurnished dwelling house, but may include accommodation reasonably required for the storage of furniture."

34. This Order shall be construed as one with the 1920 Order, the 1921 (Officers) Order, the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and the 1949 Order and shall come into operation on the 1st April 1961, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to the 1st April 1961, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st April 1961.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 11th June 1920; the Orders of the 9th March 1921 and the Order of the 29th September 1949, as amended by subsequent Orders.

2. The normal maximum rate of the allowances for constant attendance is increased from £100 a year to £104 a year in the case of officers and from 35s. a week to 40s. a week in the case of ratings and the maximum rate for exceptional cases of very severe disablement is increased from 70s. a week to 80s. a week in the case of officers, nurses and ratings. (Articles 2, 7, 10 and 14.)

3. Provision is made for eligibility for an award of constant attendance allowance to be extended to pensioners whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 80 per cent. or 90 per cent. (Articles 2, 7, 10 and 14.)

4. The pension rates for certain widows of officers and ratings are increased by £26 a year and by 10s. a week respectively. (Articles 3, 12 and 18.)

5. The allowances payable to widows in respect of children are increased from £73 or £67 a year to £83 10s. or £77 10s. a year in the case of children of officers and from 25s. to 29s. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 4, 8, 15 and 31.)

6.—(1) The rates of pensions and allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mother) are increased from £112 10s., £88 or £104 10s. a year to £128 10s., £100 or £120 10s. a year in the case of children of officers and from 30s. or 40s. a week to 34s. 6d. or 46s. a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 30 and 31.)

(2) The ratings of pensions payable to motherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, are increased from £130 a year to £149 10s. a year in the case of children of officers and from 50s. a week to 57s. 6d. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 5, 9, 16, 30 and 31.)

7.—(1) The rates of pensions for 100 per cent. disablement are increased by £34 a year in the case of officers and nurses and by 12s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings with proportionate increases for lower degrees of disablement. (Articles 6, 11, 13, 17 and 29.)

(2) The maximum rates of the "Addition to Service Retired Pay" payable to certain disabled officers and nurses are increased from £256 a year to £290 a year in the case of officers and from £231 a year to £265 a year in the case of nurses. (Articles 11 and 13.)

8. The allowance for unemployable pensioners is increased from £143 a year to £164 a year in the case of officers and from 55s. a week to 63s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 21.)

9.—(1) The total additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment is increased from £78 a year to £91 a year in the case of officers and from 30s. a week to 35s. a week in the case of ratings. (Articles 21, 24 and 25.)

(2) The allowances payable in respect of children of a pensioner who has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions, are increased in respect of the first or only child from £39 a year to £45 10s. a year in the case of officers and from 15s. a week to 17s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings and in respect of other children from 7s. 6d. a week to 9s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings. (Articles 21, 24 and 25.)

10. Provision is made for the award of a comforts allowance at the higher rate of 20s. a week to a pensioner whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 80 per cent. or 90 per cent. and who is in receipt of allowances for constant attendance and unemployability. (Article 22.)

11. The maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation is increased from 34s. a week to 39s. a week. (Article 23.)

12. The maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased from 50s. a week to 57s. 6d. a week. (Articles 24 and 25.)

13. An allowance at the rate of £52 a year in the case of officers and nurses and 20s. a week in the case of ratings is introduced for pensioners who are in receipt of constant attendance allowance at a rate above the normal maximum and who are ordinarily in employment. (Article 27.)

14. The allowances for wear and tear of clothing are increased from £6 and £10 a year to £7 10s. and £12 10s. a year respectively. (Article 28.)

15. The maximum rate of education allowances for children is increased from £80 a year to £120 a year. (Article 32.)

16. The maximum rent allowance payable to certain widows is increased from 25s. a week to 29s. a week. Widows of officers are made eligible for the allowance on the same conditions as widows of ratings. (Article 33.)

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, 28 & 29 Vict. c. 73., it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend the Order concerning retired pay, pensions and other grants in cases where the disablement or death of members of the naval forces is due to service after the 2nd September 1939:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

The Order in Council dated the 29th September 1949, relating to members of the naval forces as therein defined, as amended by the Orders in Council of the 28th October 1949, of the 31st May 1951, of the 29th April 1952, of the 18th July 1952, of the 28th May 1953, of the 5th January 1955, of the 29th June 1956, of the 24th January 1957, of the 27th November 1957, of the 13th May 1959 and of the 8th April 1960, shall be further amended in the respects set out in the following Articles of this Order which shall be construed as one with the said Order of the 29th September 1949, as so amended.

1. In Article 1 (which contains definitions)—

(a) for paragraph (2) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(2) 'apprentice' means a person undergoing full-time training for any trade, business, profes-

sion, office, employment or vocation, and not in receipt of earnings which provide him, wholly or substantially, with a livelihood: ";

(b) for paragraph (17) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(17) 'member of the Naval Reserve Forces' means a member of the naval forces who is a member of—

- (a) the Royal Fleet Reserve;
- (b) the Royal Naval Reserve;
- (c) the Royal Marine Forces Volunteer Reserve;
- (d) the Royal Naval Special Reserve;
- (e) the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, including the Royal Naval Volunteer Supplementary Reserve, the Royal Naval Volunteer (Wireless) Reserve and the Royal Naval Volunteer (Postal) Reserve;
- (f) the Women's Royal Naval Reserve, including the Women's Royal Naval Supplementary Reserve;
- (g) the Women's Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve;
- (h) Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve;
- (i) the Voluntary Aid Detachment Reserve; but does not include such a member of the Naval Reserve Forces during any period when he is mobilised: "

(c) for subparagraphs (b) and (c) of paragraph (30) there shall be substituted the following subparagraphs:

"(b) enrolled in Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service or in the Auxiliary Section thereof or in the Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service Reserve;

(c) enrolled in the Women's Royal Naval Service or a reserve thereof; "

2. In paragraph (2) of Article 14 (which provides for the award of education allowances in respect of children of disabled members of the naval forces) for the figures £80 there shall be substituted the figures £120.

3. In Article 15, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for constant attendance on disabled members of the naval forces) for the words and figures "100 per cent.", there shall be substituted the words and figures "not less than 80 per cent." and for the figures £100, 35s., £182 and 70s. the figures £104, 40s., £208 and 80s. respectively.

4. After Article 15 there shall be inserted the following Article:

"15A. *Severe disablement occupational allowance.*—Where a member of the naval forces is in receipt of an allowance for constant attendance at a rate increased under the proviso to Article 15, or would be in receipt of such an allowance if he were not in a hospital or other institution, he may for any period during which he is, in the opinion of the Minister, ordinarily employed in a gainful occupation, be awarded an allowance at the rate of £52 a year in the case of an officer, or 20s. a week in any other case:

Provided that no allowance shall be payable under this Article to a member for any period in respect of which he—

(a) is eligible for an award under Article 17 (2); or

(b) is in receipt of any such benefit as is mentioned in paragraph (6) of Article 20 or a treatment allowance increased under paragraph (3) of that Article."

5. In Article 16, as amended (Order of the 5th January 1955), (which provides for the award of allowances for wear and tear of clothing) for the figure £6 there shall be substituted the figures £7 10s. and for the figures £10, wherever the same appear, the figures £12 10s.

6. In Article 17, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the supplementation of retired pay or pension and the award of allowances for unemployable pensioners)—

(a) in paragraph (2), for the figures £143 and 55s. there shall be substituted the figures £164 and 63s. respectively;

(b) in paragraph (3) (c), for the figures £42 and 20s. there shall be substituted the figures £55 and 25s. respectively;

(c) in paragraph (3) (d), for the figures £78 and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures £91 and 35s. respectively;

(d) for subparagraph (f) of paragraph (3), there shall be substituted the following subparagraph:

"(f) Where an allowance has been awarded under Article 13 or subparagraph (e) of this paragraph in respect of the child or children of an officer, the rate thereof in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children may be increased to £45 10s. a year, and where an allowance has been so awarded in respect of the child or children of a rating, the rate thereof in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children may be increased to 17s. 6d. a week and in respect of each other of those children to 9s. 6d. a week."

7. For subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of Article 17A (See Order of the 24th January 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for comforts) there shall be substituted the following subparagraph:

"(a) at the rate of £52 a year in the case of an officer or 20s. a week in the case of a rating where the member is in receipt of an allowance under Article 15 and is—

(i) in receipt of an allowance under Article 17; or

(ii) in receipt of retired pay or pension in respect of disablement the degree of which is 100 per cent. and which has been awarded in respect of multiple injuries, which, in the opinion of the Minister, render his disablement so severe as to justify the award of an allowance at the aforementioned rate;"

8. In Article 18, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances for lowered standard of occupation) for the figures 34s. there shall be substituted the figures 39s.

9. In Article 20, as amended (Orders of the 31st May 1951, and the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of personal and additional allowances to a member of the naval forces during periods of approved treatment)—

(a) to paragraph (b) of the proviso to paragraph (1) there shall be added the words and figures "or, subject to the provisions of paragraph (b) of the proviso to Article 15A, under that Article.";

(b) in paragraph (3), for the figures 50s., wherever the same appear, there shall be substituted the figures 57s. 6d.;

(c) in paragraph (a) of the proviso to paragraph (4), for the figures £78 and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures £91 and 35s. respectively;

(d) for paragraph (b) of the proviso to paragraph (4) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:

"(b) where an increased allowance has been granted under paragraph (3) of this Article, the rate of the allowance awarded under the foregoing provisions of this paragraph in respect of the child or children of an officer may, in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children, be increased to £45 10s. a year, and where an allowance has been so awarded in respect of the child or children of a rating, the rate thereof in respect of that child or the elder or eldest of those children may be increased to 17s. 6d. a week and in respect of each other of those children to 9s. 6d. a week;"

(e) in paragraph (5), for the figures £78 and 30s. there shall be substituted the figures £91 and 35s. respectively.

10. In Article 22, (which provides for the award of allowances for part-time treatment) for the words and figures "Article 14, 15, 16, 17 (2), 17A or 18A," in the proviso, as amended (Order of the 24th January 1957), there shall be substituted the words and figures "Article 14, 15, 15A, 16, 17 (2), 17A or 18A."

11. In paragraph (3) of Article 29, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions for unmarried dependants living as wives) for the figures £177 and 58s. 6d. there shall be substituted the figures £203 and 68s. 6d. respectively.

12. In Article 30, as amended (Orders of the 31st May 1951, and 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of rent allowances to certain widows and unmarried dependants) for the word "rating" wherever the same appears, there shall be substituted the words "member of the naval forces", for the figures 25s. there shall be substituted the figures 29s. and paragraph (5) shall be deleted.

13. In paragraph (2) of Article 31, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to widowers) for the figures £177 and 66s. there shall be substituted the figures £203 and 76s. respectively.

14. In Article 32, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of allowances in respect of children under the age limit)—

(a) in paragraphs (2) and (3), for the figures £73, £67 and 25s. there shall be substituted the figures £83 10s., £77 10s. and 29s. respectively;

(b) in paragraph (5), for the figures £112 10s., £88, £104 10s., 30s. and 40s. there shall be substituted the figures £128 10s., £100, £120 10s., 34s. 6d. and 46s. respectively.

15. In Article 33, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for the award of pensions to motherless or fatherless children under the age limit) for the figures £112 10s., £88, £104 10s., 30s. and 40s. there shall be substituted the figures £128 10s., £100, £120 10s., 34s. 6d. and 46s. respectively.

16. In paragraph (3) of Article 34, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which provides for awards to or in respect of certain children who have attained the age of 18 years and are incapable of self-support) for the figures £130 and 50s. there shall be substituted the figures £149 10s. and 57s. 6d. respectively.

17. In paragraph (2) of Article 35, (which provides for the award of education allowances in respect of children of deceased members of the naval forces) for the figures £80 there shall be substituted the figures £120.

18. In subparagraph (a) of paragraph (3) of Article 40, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which prescribes the rates of disablement addition on a pension basis) for the figures £256 and £231 there shall be substituted the figures £290 and £265 respectively.

19. For the Tables in the Second Schedule, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which set out the yearly rates of retired pay for disabled officers and the weekly rates of pensions for disabled ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the First Schedule to this Order.

20. For the Tables in the Third Schedule, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which set out the amounts of the gratuities or weekly allowances with or without terminal gratuities pay-

able for disablement assessed at less than 20 per cent.) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Second Schedule to this Order.

21. For the Tables in the Fourth Schedule, as amended (Order of the 27th November 1957), (which set out the yearly rates of pensions for widows of officers and the weekly rates of pensions for widows of ratings) there shall be substituted the Tables set out in the Third Schedule to this Order.

22. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st April 1961, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to the 1st April 1961, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following the 1st April 1961.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

1. This Order amends the Order of the 29th September, 1949, as amended by subsequent Orders.
2. The maximum rate of education allowances for children is increased from £80 a year to £120 a year. (Articles 2 and 17.)
3. The normal maximum rate of an allowance payable for constant attendance is increased from £100 a year to £104 a year in the case of officers and from 35s. a week to 40s. a week in the case of ratings, and the maximum rate for exceptional cases of very severe disablement is increased from £182 a year to £208 a year in the case of officers and from 70s. a week to 80s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 3.)

4. Provision is made for eligibility for an award of constant attendance allowance to be extended to pensioners whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 80 per cent. or 90 per cent. (Article 3.)

5. An allowance at the rate of £52 a year in the case of officers and 20s. a week in the case of ratings is introduced for pensioners who are in receipt of constant attendance allowance at a rate above the normal maximum and who are ordinarily in employment. (Article 4.)

6. The allowances for wear and tear of clothing are increased from £6 and £10 a year to £7 10s. and £12 10s. a year respectively. (Article 5.)

7. The allowance for unemployable pensioners is increased from £143 a year to £164 a year in the case of officers and from 55s. a week to 63s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 6.)

8.—(1) The total additional allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of an unemployable pensioner and of a pensioner receiving approved treatment is increased from £78 a year to £91 a year in the case of officers and from 30s. a week to 35s. a week in the case of ratings. (Articles 6 and 9.)

(2) The allowances payable in respect of children of a pensioner who has been awarded a special allowance either on the grounds of unemployability or because, during a course of approved treatment, he is not entitled to sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions, are increased in respect of the first or only child from £39 a year to £45 10s. a year in the case of officers and from 15s. a week to 17s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings and in respect of other children from 7s. 6d. a week to 9s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings. (Articles 6 and 9.)

9. Provision is made for the award of a comforts allowance at the higher rate of 20s. a week to a pensioner whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 80 per cent. or 90 per cent. and who is in receipt of allowances for constant attendance and unemployability. (Article 7.)

10. The maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation is increased from 34s. a week to 39s. a week. (Article 8.)

11. The maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under National Insurance provisions is increased from 50s. a week to 57s. 6d. a week. (Article 9.)

12. The pensions payable to unmarried dependants living as wives of deceased members of the naval forces are increased from £177 a year to £203 a year in the case of officers and from 58s. 6d. a week to 68s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 11.)

13. The maximum rent allowance payable to certain widows is increased from 25s. a week to 29s. a week. Widows of officers are made eligible for the allowance on the same conditions as widows of ratings. (Article 12.)

14. The allowances payable to widows in respect of children are increased from £73 a year to £83 10s. a year in the case of officers, from £67 a year to £77 10s. a year in the case of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers and from 25s. a week to 29s. a week in the case of ratings. (Article 14 (a).)

15. The rates of pensions and allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of their mother) are increased from £112 10s. a year to £128 10s. a year in the case of children of officers, from £88 or £104 10s. a year to £100 or £120 10s. a year (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of Commissioned Officers (Branch List) and Warrant Officers, and from 30s. or 40s. a week to 34s. 6d. or 46s. a week (according to the age of the child), in the case of children of ratings. (Articles 14 (b) and 15.)

16. The rates of pensions payable to motherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, are increased from £130 a year to £149 10s. a year in the case of children of officers and from 50s. a week to 57s. 6d. a week in the case of children of ratings. (Article 16.)

17. The maximum rates of disablement addition on a pension basis payable to certain officers in receipt of service retired pay are increased from £256 a year to £290 a year in the case of male officers and from £231 a year to £265 a year in the case of women officers. (Article 18.)

18. Articles 19, 20 and 21 substitute new Tables for those contained in the Second, Third and Fourth Schedules to the Order and have the general effect of increasing—

- (a) the rates of pensions in respect of 100 per cent. disablement by £34 a year in the case of officers and by 12s. 6d. a week in the case of ratings and the rates of pensions for lower degrees of disablement proportionately;
- (b) awards for cases of minor injuries and other cases of less than 20 per cent. disablement;
- (c) the rates of pensions for certain widows by £26 a year in the case of officers and by 10s. a week in the case of ratings.
