William HUGHES, Esq., C.B.E., J.P., J.L., Labour Parliamentary candidate for East Perthshire in 1945 and in 1950. Lord Provost of Dundee, 1954-1960. Chairman, Glenrothes Development Corporation. Member of the Scottish Transport Council.

George Samuel LINDGREN, Esq., J.P., Labour Member of Parliament for the Wellingborough Division, 1945-1959. Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of National Insurance, 1945-1946 ; Ministry of Civil Aviation, 1946-1950 ; Ministry of Town and Country Planning, 1950-1951 and Ministry of Local Government and Planning, 1951. Member of the Hertfordshire County Council, 1931-1949 ; 1952-1955 and since 1958.

The Right Honourable Arthur Hugh Elsdale MOLSON, M.P., Conservative Member of Parliament for Doncaster, 1931-1935, and for the High Peak Division since 1939. Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Works, 1951-1953 ; Joint Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Civil Aviation, 1953-1957 ; Minister of Works, 1957-1959.
