INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

And that judgment of death was duly executed and carried into effect upon the said offender, for the said offence, on the day and year aforesaid within the walls of the said Prison in which aforesaid, within the walls of the said Prison in which the said offender was confined at the time of execu-And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is now here held, on view of the body of the said offender, by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs, within twenty-four hours after the execution; and that the body of the said Wasyl Gnypiuk now here lying dead, is the identical body of the said offender, who was so convicted and executed for the offence aforesaid.
