*Samford Rural District (Footpath at Alton Hall,
Stutton) Public Path Diversion Order, 1960*

Notice is hereby given that R. F. Williams Esq., G.M., A.M.I.Mun.E., (M.T.P.), will attend at the Victory Hall, Marningtree Road, Stutton on Wednesday, 1st March 1961 at 10 a.m. for the purpose of hearing objections to the Minister's proposal to make an Order for the diversion of a footpath at Alton Hall, Stutton.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way commencing at a point about 270 yards South of Walkgate Cottages and leading in a South-Westerly direction for a distance of approximately 330 yards along the Western boundary of field O.S. No. 67 to the South-Western corner of the said field, then leading in a South-Easterly direction for a distance of approximately 177 yards to the South-Eastern corner of field O.S. No. 67 near Stutton Mill and to substitute for this a footpath commencing at the point at the South-Eastern corner of field O.S. No. 67 and leading in a North-Easterly direction for a distance of approximately 380 yards along the Eastern boundary of field O.S. No. 67 to the Northernmost point thereof about 270 yards South of Walkgate Cottages.
