- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th May 1961, to Saturday, the 13th May 1961, inclusive, and will be due 91 days
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday) 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS, 1953 Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorities (DAVID WATSON)

Whereas the authorities conferred by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, on David Watson, M.B., Ch.B., by virtue of his being a duly qualified medical practitioner, to be in possession of and to supply the drugs and preparations to which those Regulations apply were, the said David Watson having been con-victed of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act, victed of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1951, withdrawn in pursuance of the powers conferred on the Secretary of State by Regulation 29 of the aforesaid Regulations by Notices published in the London Gazette and the Edinburgh Gazette on the 26th day of June, 1959, the registered address of the said David Watson being then 34 Lyndhurst Road, Lowestoft, Suffolk.

And whereas at the same time the Secretary of State directed that it should not be lawful for the said David Watson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953:

And whereas by virtue of Regulation 29 of the Dangerous Drugs. Regulations, 1953, the Secretary of State is empowered at any time to restore such an authority as aforesaid which has been withdrawn under the said Regulation, or to suspend such a withdrawal:

And whereas I am satisfied that it is expedient to suspend the aforesaid withdrawal of authorities from the said David Watson:

Now, therefore, I hereby suspend, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 29 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1953, the aforesaid withdrawal of authorities from the said David Watson, and I further suspend the operation of the said direction regarding prescriptions given in respect of the said David Watson.

## ELIZABETH R

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of our other Realms and Territories Queen, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these Presents shall come.

Whereas We have taken into Our Royal consideration the need to mark the great constitutional change which has resulted in the independence of Sierra Leone.

And whereas We are desirous that Our Armed Forces in Sierra Leone and Our Police Force there should bear some form of recognition of this important event.

We do by these Presents, for Us, Our Heirs and occessors, institute and create a new Medal for Successors, Sierra Leone.

Firstly: The Medal shall be designated and styled "The Sierra Leone Independence Medal".

Secondly: The Medal shall be circular in shape, one and a quarter inches in diameter, of cupro-nickel and shall bear on the obverse Our Royal Effigy Crowned and on the reverse the Sierra Leone Coat of Arms surrounded by the inscrip-tion "Sierra Leone Independence, 27th April, 1961 ".

Thirdly: The persons eligible for the Medal shall be those of Our faithful subjects or others, male and female, who were serving in established posts on the strength of a unit in Our Royal Sierra Leone Military Forces or on the authorised strength of Our Sierra Leone Naval Volunteer Force or in established posts in Our Sierra Leone
