

3. any seed among the said goods not itself prohibited to be imported was mixed packed or found with seed prohibited to be imported and liable to forfeiture under the Customs Acts.

Whereby and by force of section 44 (b) and section 277 (1) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and Section 3 (1) and (3) of the Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act

specifying the name and address of a solicitor in England who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf, in default of which notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.

DECLARATIONS OF BEN LUI, CAENLOCHAN AND INVERPOLLY NATURE RESERVES

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of section 19 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, that by the Ben Lui Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961, the Caenlochan Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961 and the Inverpolly Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961 all made on the 27th day of April 1961, it was declared by the Nature Conservancy that the lands (First), (Second), (Third), (Fifth), (Sixth) and (Seventh) hereinafter described are now the subjects of Agreements entered into with them under the provisions of the Act, and the land (Fourth) hereinafter described has been acquired and is being held by them, namely:

(First) Land extending to 925 acres or thereby comprising part of the Farm of Cononish in the Parish of Killin and County of Perth.

Which Land (First) above-mentioned is shown tinted pink and enclosed within a red line on the map attached to the Ben Lui Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961.

(Second) Land extending to 6,847 acres or thereby comprising part of the Airlie Estates in the Parishes of Glenisla and of Cortachy and Clova and County of Angus.

(Third) Land extending to 1,385 acres or thereby comprising parts of the estates of Invercauld in the Parish of Crathie and Braemar and County of Aberdeen and of Gleshee in the Parish of Kirkmichael and County of Perth.

(Fourth) Land extending to 759 acres or thereby comprising part of the Glen Doll Forest in the Parish of Cortachy and Clova and County of Angus.

Which Lands (Second), (Third) and (Fourth) above mentioned are tinted pink and enclosed within a continuous red line on the map attached to the Caenlochan Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961.

(Fifth) Land extending to 9,713 acres or thereby comprising part of the estate of Inverpolly in the Parish of Lochbroom and County of Ross and Cromarty.

(Sixth) Land extending to 4,929 acres or thereby with the islands known as Rudh'a Bhrocaire, Eilean Mor, Eilean Moineasach, and Fraochlan comprising the whole of the estate of Eis-brachaidh in the Parish of Lochbroom and County of Ross and Cromarty, and

(Seventh) Land extending to 12,149 acres or thereby comprising parts of the estate of Drumrunie in the Parish of Lochbroom and County of Ross and Cromarty and of the estate of Assynt in the Parish of Assynt and County of Sutherland.

Which Lands (Fifth), (Sixth) and (Seventh) above mentioned are tinted pink and enclosed within continuous red lines on the map attached to the Inverpolly Nature Reserve No. 1 Declaration, 1961.

And it was further declared that the whole of the above-mentioned lands are being managed as nature reserves.
