Exception is also provided in the Order which will allow a vehicle to wait to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 10 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Saturdays a vehicle will not be allowed to wait on any length of road specified in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) above (except on the southerly side of King Street West from Alberton Street to a point 50 feet west of the westerly kerb line of Deansgate) unless the goods cannot reasonably be loaded or unloaded outside those hours in which case the restriction will not apply if notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police and their consent is obtained. on to or unloaded from the vehicle except between the police and their consent is obtained.

Existing traffic orders will be amended, where necessary to give effect to the above proposals.
