

CITY OF PORTSMOUTH

The Portsmouth (Traffic Regulation) (Various Roads) (No. 4) Order, 1961

On the 9th day of May 1961, the Portsmouth City Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle from waiting in any of the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this Order and to prohibit any vehicle from waiting in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Lengths of Roads in the City of Portsmouth

1. Regent Place.
2. Spring Gardens.
3. Cornwall Road.
 - (a) The north side between its junction with the east side of Fratton Road and its junction with the west side of Ariel Road.
 - (b) The south side between its junction with the east side of Fratton Road and a point 15 ft. east of the east side of Claremont Road.
4. Vectis Way—The north side.
5. Kingswell Street.
6. Fountain Street.
 - (a) The east side.
 - (b) The west side between its junction with the north side of Edinburgh Road and a point 30 ft. north of that junction.
 - (c) The west side between a point 190 ft. north of the north side of Edinburgh Road and the northern end of Fountain Street.

SECOND SCHEDULE

East Street, Old Portsmouth—Between its junction with the east side of Broad Street and a point 160 ft. east of that junction.

CITY AND COUNTY OF NEWCASTLE
UPON TYNE*City and County of Newcastle upon Tyne Development Plan (Blandford Street Comprehensive Development Area)*

Notice is hereby given that on the 5th day of May 1961, the Minister of Housing and Local Government amended the above Development Plan. A certified copy of the Development Plan as amended by the Minister has been deposited at the City Planning Department, 2 St. Nicholas Buildings, St. Nicholas Street, Newcastle upon Tyne 1.

Planning Act, 1947, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the making of the amendment, he may, within six weeks from the 12th day of May 1961, make application to the High Court.
