## Waiting Restrictions Borough of Hendon

The Minister of Transport proposes to make Regulations under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of street specified in the Schedule hereto, and in the first 45 feet of adjoining

Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait in order to pick up and set down passengers, to load and unload goods, to carry out essential services, or while in use by local authorities in an emergency.

1. Armitage Road—between the north side of its junction with Accommodation Road, and a point with Accommodation Road.

Hoop Lane—from the south side of its junction with Golders Way, north-eastward for a distance of 100 feet.

(e) to provide for the stopping up of six lengths of private means of access to premises adjoining or adjacent to land comprised in the route of the said special road after the new means of access have been opened for traffic;

(f) that the County Council of Leicester will become the highway authority for the new roads, footpaths and bridleways, with the exception of the new length of the London—Carlisle—Glasgow—Inverness Trunk Road (A.6) in Kegworth, on the 1st day of April next after the day on which notice is given by the Minister to the Council that the said highways are opened for through traffic.
