The Bridgewater Canals Rules (Revocation) Order, 1961

Made - - - -	26th May 1961
Laid before Parliament	1st June 1961
Coming into Operation	23rd June 1961

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th day of May 1961.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Manchester Ship Canal Company are the owners of the Duke of Bridgewater's Canal, the Manchester and Salford Junction Canal, the Runcorn and Weston Canal and the Mersey and Irwell Navigation (in this Order referred to as the Bridgewater Canals) and whereas by an Order in Council made on the eighteenth day of May 1870, by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, Amendment Act, 1862 (25 & 26 Vict. c. 63), Rules were made concerning the Lights and Signals to be carried and concerning the steps to be taken by vessels navigating the Bridgewater Canals and whereas the Manchester Ship Canal Company have applied for the revocation of these Rules:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 738 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60), and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The Rules concerning the Bridgewater Canals made by the said Order in Council on the eighteenth day of May 1870, are hereby revoked.

2.—(1) This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of June 1961, and may be cited as the *Bridgewater Canals Rules (Revocation) Order, 1961*.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply for the interpretation of this Order, as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order revokes the Rules made by Order in Council on the 18th day of May 1870, concerning lights and signals to be carried and steps to be taken by vessels navigating on the canals referred to in the Order. The matters dealt with in the revoked rules will now be dealt with in Bye-laws made under the Manchester Ship Canal Acts, 1885 to 1956.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th June 1961, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £270,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th June 1961, to Saturday, the 17th June 1961, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such
