## Waiting Restrictions Borough of Bromley

The Minister of Transport proposes to make Regulations under the. Road Traffic Act, 1960; as amended:
(a) to restrict waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclissive in the lengths of street speciGied in the Fipst Schedule hereto and to include the first 45 feet of all adjoining side atreets except South Street, Tweedy Road end.
(Exemptions would be provided in the Regulations to permit vehicles to wait in order to pick up and set down passengers, to carry out :essential . services, or ${ }^{*}$ while: in use by local authorities in an emergency. Exemptions would allso be provided to permit vehicles to wait for the purpose of loading or unloading goods except às stated in item (b) below.)
(b) to prohibit, waiting by vehicles for the purposes of loading and unloading goods between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and $6.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on alternate sides of the rogid on allternate days from Mondays to Șatundays indlusive, and to limẹt waiting for the same purposes during the same hours on the opposite side of the rôad to a maximum period of twenty minutes, in the length of street specified in the Secbnd Sochedule hereto. (This length of striet is also inioluded in the First Schedule.)
(c) to resticict waiting by vehicles between the hours of $8.30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and $6.30 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. on alternate sides of the soad on alternate. days on Mondays to. Sarturdays' inclusive. or on the opposite side of the road for a period of more than two hours in any period of four hours, in the lemgth of street specified in the Third Schedule hereto.
(Exemptions: would be provided in the Regulations. to permit velhioles to. wait on eeither side of the street in order to piok up and set down pastssengers, 'to load' and' uniload 'goods;' to carry out -essential services; or while in use' by locad authorities in an emergency.)
