Dorking and Horley Rural District Council, Right of Way No. 136A (Parishes of Wotton and Holmwood) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961.

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 8th June 1961, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the following Parishes.

WOTTON AND HOLMWOOD

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way on foot running from Point "A" at Brookwick Copse north-west of property known as "Tillings Springs" in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 330 feet to junction with Bridleway No. 246 at point "B", to a line running roughly west from the said Point "A" on the map to the junction with Bridleway No. 246 at Point "C" on Wotton Common.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of this Order is payable in accordance with section 31 as applied by subsection (2) of section 113 of the Highways Act, 1959, to which reference should be made.

The Bullingdon Rural District (New Manor Farm, Chalgrove) Diversion Order, 1961

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 14th day of June 1961, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land at New Manor Farm, Chalgrove.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running from the entrance to New Manor Farm in a south easterly direction for a distance of approximately 280 yards to a new path commencing at the same point and running in the same direction for a distance of approximately 281 yards but on the northern side of the ditch separating Parcels numbered 47 and 48 on O.S. map Oxon XLVI/8 (1921 edition).

CHESTERTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Chesterton Rural District Council (Toft Footpath No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961

On the 5th day of June 1961, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from a point approximately 40 yards west of

a stile entrance at High Street near the north east corner of the field Ordnance Survey Parcel No. 70 (Ordnance Survey Sheet Cambridgeshire XLVI.6, 1902 Edition) in a south westerly direction across the field for a distance of approximately 190 yards to a point near the western boundary of the field, to a new route running from the point approximately 40 yards west of the aforesaid stile entrance at High Street in a general westerly direction along the northern boundary of the field for a distance of approximately 143 yards to a point approximately 40 yards east of the western boundary of the field and thence in a south westerly direction for a distance of approximately 63 yards to join the existing path at a point near the western boundary of the field. This diversion will take place on the 17th day of July 1961.

The Order becomes operative as from the 16th day of June 1961, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL OF THURROCK

Thurrock Urban District Council (Footpath 32, Branksome Avenue, Stanford-le-Hope) Diversion Order, 1961

The public right of way commencing approximately 250 feet east of the junction of Branksome Avenue with First Avenue and running in a diagonal direction for a distance of approximately 455 feet across the gardens of the properties known as "Shannon," "The Nook" and "Dalehurst," Branksome Avenue, Stanford-le-Hope.

To

A line commencing approximately 350 feet east of the junction of Branksome Avenue with First Avenue and running in a north-westerly direction along the boundary of the properties "Shannon" and "The Nook" for a distance of approximately 320 feet and thence in a north-easterly direction across the extremities of the gardens of the properties "The Nook" and "Dalehurst" for a distance of approximately 230 feet to where it joins the line of the existing footpath.
