The London Traffic (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No. 5) Regulations, 1961 (S.I. 1961/1138)

Under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, as amended, the Ministry of Transport has made regulations, coming into operation on 28th June 1961, which restrict the speed of vehicles to 40 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.
