

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

ILFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Ilford Borough Council (Eastern Avenue to Billet Road and Hainault Road Footpaths) Extinguishment Order, 1961.

The above Order made on the 22nd day of June 1961, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate at Little Heath in the Borough of Ilford.

The effect will be to extinguish the public rights of way running (a) from Eastern Avenue in a north-easterly direction to Billet Road (shown as Path No. 13 in the Statement accompanying that part of the Definitive Map showing public rights of way, prepared under the National Park and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, as relates to the Borough of Ilford) and (b) from the said Path No. 13 in a north-easterly direction to Hainault Road (shown as Path No. 16 in the before-mentioned Statement), the said rights of way having approximate lengths of 677 yards and 203 yards respectively and overall average widths of 3 feet or thereabouts.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Ilford, between 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 31st day of July 1961, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

CITY OF WAKEFIELD

The Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Wakefield hereby give notice that it is their intention on Friday, the 14th day of July 1961, to apply to the Magistrates' Court for the City of Wakefield sitting at the Town Hall, Wood Street in the said City, at the hour of 10 in the forenoon for an Order under the provisions of section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the stopping up of part of the highway known as Bread Street in the said City extending from the junction thereof with Northgate for a distance of 37 feet or thereabouts and shown coloured pink on the plan numbered D.2858/3/13 (a copy of which may be inspected, free of charge, at room 19 in the Town Hall in the said City during normal office hours), on the ground that the part of the said highway so proposed to be stopped up is unnecessary in view of the intention of the Mayor Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Wakefield to construct a new highway 24 feet or thereabouts in width between Bread Street and Cross Square in the position indicated on the said plan but subject to the reservation of the footpath over so much of the part of Bread Street so proposed to be stopped up as is shown hatched red on the said plan.

BOROUGH OF ECCLES

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Eccles in the county of Lancaster (being the highway authority for the highways hereinafter mentioned) intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at Irwell Place, Eccles aforesaid, on Wednesday, the 19th day of July 1961, at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the stopping up, on the grounds that they are unnecessary, of the highways consisting of the under-mentioned street and passages within the Borough of Eccles aforesaid:

(a) the street known as Clegg Street which extends from Silk Street in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 54 yards;

(b) the back passage situated between Clegg Street and James Terrace which extends from Silk Street in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 52 yards;

(c) the passage known as James Terrace which extends from Silk Street in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 51 yards.
