Notice is hereby given that the Cheshire County Council intend to apply to the Court of Summary Jurisdiction for the Petty Sessional Division of Sale sitting at Tatton Road, Sale, at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, the 8th day of August 1961, for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the stopping up of the highway known as Old Manchester Road, Carrington, B.5158 in the Rural District of Bucklow. *Borough of Bebington, Dibbinsdale Road to Acre
Lane Public Footpath (Part) Extinguishment Order

THE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF
ROCHFORD*Rockford (No. 1) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961*

The above Order made on the 11th day of July 1961, is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.
