The Guildford Public Path (Walnut Tree Close to Woodbridge Meadows) Extinguishment Order, 1961

On the 29th day of June 1961, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modification, the above Order. Its effect is to extinguish the public right of way running from Walnut Tree Close through a tunnel beneath the railway embankment to the southern boundary of the Woodbridge Meadows Industrial Estate as from the 28th day of July 1961.
