The Duke of Anjou was yesterday with the Duke of Berwick at Guadalaxara, and intends, as is said, to go from thence to Burgos.

Lidbm, July 9, N.S. A Courier arrived here last Night from Rome, being sent with the Cardinal's Cap to the Pope's Nuncio, who is lately promoted to that Dignity.
