NEWCASTLE-UNDER-LYME RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Newcastle-under-Lyme Rural District Council (Madeley Heath/Hungerford Lane—Footpath No. 54) Extinguishment Order, 1961.

WYCOMBE RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Wycombe Rural District Council, Riversdale, Spade Oak, Well End Public Path Diversion Order, 1961

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th day of September 1961, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

The effect of the Order will be to divert the public right of way crossing in a south-easterly direction two plots of land fronting the River Thames at Spade Oak, Well End, to a line following in a southerly direction the boundary between the two plots of land.

RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL OF MALDON

Maldon Rural District Council (Bohuns Hall, Tollesbury) (No. 5) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961.

On the 29th day of August 1961, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from the south-eastern corner of field No. 296 on the Ordnance Survey Map (1922 Edition) at a point approximately 1,020 feet east of Prentice Hall Farm House and at its junction with a path or track leading from Prentice Hall Lane and proceeding in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1,130 feet through O.S. field Nod. 296 and O.S. field Nod. 300 terminating on the eastern side of O.S. field Nod. 300 where it joins the public footpath to Elysian Gardens, to a line commencing in the south-eastern corner of the said O.S. field No. 296 and proceeding in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 35 feet to the boundary of O.S. field No. 352 and thence along the northern boundary of the said field Nod. 352 for a distance of approximately 900 feet and thence in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of O.S. field No. 300 for a distance of approximately 660 feet terminating at a point where it joins the footpath leading to Elysian Gardens, Tollesbury. The old footpath will be closed to the public as from 11th October 1961.
