RATES OF INTEREST ON LOCAL LOANS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Public Works Loans Act, 1897 (60 and 61 Vict. c. 51), the Public Works Loans Act, 1935 (26 Geo. 5 & 1 Edw. 8 c. 5) and the Local Authorities Loans Act, 1945 (8 & 9 Geo. 6 c. 18), they have directed by their Minute of 12th October 1961 that on loans advanced to local authorities from the Local Loans Fund, on and after 14th October 1961, there shall be chargeable in lieu of the rates fixed by the Treasury Minute of the 3rd August 1961 the following rates of interest:
