Dublin, Nov. 30.
N the 26th instant the Lord Lieutenant and Council having taken notice that divers perfons who had passed Certificates from His Majesties late Commissioners appointed for putting in execution the Acts of settlement and explanation of fuch Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in pursuance of the said Ads have been adjudged to belong unto them, have hitherto neglected to pals their Letters Parents thereupon , by realon whereof, His Majestics Revenue arising by His new Quit-Rents, is very much Unsetled, thought fit to publish their Order and Declaration, That all persons who have passed any Certificates from His Majesties said Commissioners of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be setled upon them or reflored unto them, do at their perils pass their Letters Patents thereupon, within four Months after the faid 26th of November.

Cadis, Nov. 18. The Warnick and Garland are lately failed to Convoy a Fleet of Merchant ships to the North-West of the Southern Cape; the Dragon put in here to take in a supply of fresh Provisions. Five French men of

war are now riding in the Road of Gibralter.

Yesterday was carried into Tangier a man of war of Cally of Eight Guns, having on board about 50 Moors taken in these seas roving in search after prizes. The Lord Middleson is fafely arrived and fixed in his Government of Tangier, where his Excellency the Lord Howard as yet continues with much patience expecting his Seguras from the Emperour of Morocco, whole engagements far within the Countrey have hithertoput a Rop to this Negotiation.

Vienna, Nov. 27. Since the arrival of the Contract for the Marriage between the King of Poland and the Arch-duichels the Emperouts eldeft Sifter; the Empetour has Ordered her to be treated as Queen a An Ho-mourable Embassy is also suddenly expected from Poland,

From Hungary, we are more and more apprehensive of some disturbance in those parts. The Turks freshly infifting upon the demolishing of the Fort Leopold, fince shey were so easily before complyed with in that near Somorra- They feem much distatished with the Hayslukes, making fresh complaints against them, and threatming reprifals; they have lately drawn into Newhaustleleven Companyes of foot above the number of the usual Garrison. The Bassa has also sent to several Towns al Garrison. and Ciries of Hungary to command them to pay him con-tribution, but we have no confirmation of their burning the Town of Spella, as was formerly advised.

Venice, Nov. 30. Some of our Advices from the Laoth feems to perswade us, that the disturbances, in the Ortoman Court are not yet ended, and that although the Grand Segnier were removed from Lariffa, yet he was nor perswaded that it would be safe for him to march into Conflantimple, the People as well as the Soldiery being Inclined eliber out of pity or affection to protect the Sul-tins brethren ; this confideration of the doubtfulnels of offairs, had so far prevailed with the Grand Visier, that though he has received frequent invitations equivalent to Commands from the Grand Segnior to come to the Court, he has hitherto found several presences to continue in Candia, endeavouring to perswade his Master of the necessity of his presence for the security of his new Conquests, where he employs great numbers of men at the repair-ing of the ruined fortifications, and rebuilding the houses which were deflroyed by the long Siege.

The Captain Baffa keeps Ifill at lea attending the Viaers Orders, who gives him constant emploiment for his ships, sending them into Mores to transport Provisions for the supply of his Army, but the Gallies are fent to the feveral Ports of that Illand, where they are laid up for

this winter.

They farther tell us that the Governours and Commanders of Tunis, Algiers and Tripoli feem very apprehensive of the encreasing power of the Emperour of Moroccos who has much enlarged his Dominions beyond what was enjoyed by his Predecessors, and has entertained thoughts of reducing those ports to his obedience, upon which account they have made their addresses to the Grand Seguior and the Visier, who seems inclinable to assist them if attempted, his Martial spirit prompting him to entertain all opportunities of action,

The Senate intends to appoint Commissioners to be fent into Dalmatia to consult with the Turks their neigh, bors about the Regulation of their bounds; the Turks having thought fit upon the peace to reflore to us a confiderable portion of the Countrey about 150 Leagues in compais, which they had usurped upon us, which the Senate is pleased to affign for the maintenance of those of Candia, who have cholen rather to loose their Houses and Estates then to live under the Turkish jurisdiction.

Count Portia after an extraordinary hazard he ran at fea is here arrived, and General spaar suddenly expect, ed with the remaining German forces which ferved under his Command during the fiege of Candia, and gave msny proofs of their valour, which induces the Emperour and the several Princes of Germany, from whom they

were sent to desire their return.

Genous, Dec. 4. The last week arrived a ship from Lisbanne with Letters of the 10th past, advising us, that they are there fitting up three great ships which may be ready in few weeks to convoy a new Viceroy to the Esse Indies, they having advice of the decease of the old one, and that they had telligence of the safe arrival of three of their ships at Brazille from the East Indies very sighly laden, which withs he findedly are the decease of the richly laden, which might be fuddenly expected at Lisbonne with fix other thips which were ready to put to lea from thence laden with Sugars.
