Dublin, Nov. 30.

ON the 24th instant the Lord Lieutenant and Council having taken notice that divers persons who had passed Certificates from His Majesties late Commissioners appointed for putting in execution the Acts of settlement and explanation of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in pursuance of the said Acts have been adjudged to belong unto them, have hitherto neglected to pass their Letters Patents thereupon, by reason whereof, His Majesties Revenue arising by His new Quilt-Rents, is very much unsettled, thought fit to publish their Order and Declaration, That all persons who have passed any Certificates from His Majesties said Commissioners of any Lands, Tenements, or Hereditaments to be settled upon them or restored unto them, do at their perils pass their Letters Patents thereupon, within four Months after the said 26th of November.

Cadix, Nov. 18. The *Warwick* and *Garland* are lately sailed to Convey a Fleet of Merchant ships to the North-west of the Southern Cape; the *Dragon* put in here to take in a supply of fresh Provisions. Five French men of war are now riding in the Road of *Gibraltar*.

Yesterday was carried into *Tangier* a man of war of Gally of Eight Guns, having on board about 50 Moors taken in these seas roving in search after prizes. The Lord *Middleton* is safely arrived and fixed in his Government of *Tangier*, where his Excellency the Lord *Howard* as yet continues with much patience expecting his Seguras from the Emperour of *Morocco*, whose engagements far within the Countrey have hitherto put a stop to this Negotiation.

Vienna, Nov. 27. Since the arrival of the Contract for the Marriage between the King of *Poland* and the Arch-duchess the Emperours eldest Sister; the Emperour has Ordered her to be treated as Queen & An Honourable Embassy is also suddenly expected from *Poland*, for the completing of this affair.

From *Hungary*, we are more and more apprehensive of some disturbance in those parts. The Turks freshly insisting upon the demolishing of the Fort *Leopold*, since they were so easily before complied with in that near *Somorra*. They seem much dissatisfied with the Haydukes, making fresh complaints against them, and threatening reprisals; they have lately drawn into *Nemhausel* eleven Companies of foot above the number of the usual Garrison. The Bassa has also sent to several Towns and Cities of *Hungary* to command them to pay him contribution, but we have no confirmation of their burning the Town of *Stella*, as was formerly advised.

Venice, Nov. 30. Some of our Advices from the *Levant* seems to persuade us, that the disturbances, in the Ottoman Court are not yet ended, and that although the Grand Segnior were removed from *Larissa*, yet he was not persuaded that it would be safe for him to march into *Constantinople*, the People as well as the Soldiery being inclined either out of pity or affection to protect the Sultans Brethren; this consideration of the doubtfulness of affairs, had so far prevailed with the Grand Visier, that though he has received frequent invitations equivalent to Commands from the Grand Segnior to come to the Court, he has hitherto found several pretexts to continue in *Candia*, endeavouring to persuade his Master of the necessity of his presence for the security of his new Conquests,

where he employs great numbers of men at the repairing of the ruined fortifications, and rebuilding the houses which were destroyed by the long Siege.

The Captain *Bassa* keeps still at sea attending the *Vissers* Orders, who gives him constant employment for his ships, sending them into *Morocco* to transport Provisions for the supply of his Army, but the Gallies are sent to the several Ports of that Island, where they are laid up for this winter.

They farther tell us that the Governours and Commanders of *Tunis*, *Algiers* and *Tripoli* seem very apprehensive of the encreasing power of the Emperour of *Morocco*, who has much enlarged his Dominions beyond what was enjoyed by his Predecessors, and has entertained thoughts of reducing those ports to his obedience, upon which account they have made their addresses to the Grand Segnior and the Visier, who seems inclinable to assist them if attempted, his Martial spirit prompting him to entertain all opportunities of action.

The Senate intends to appoint Commissioners to be sent into *Dalmatia* to consult with the Turks their neighbours about the Regulation of their bounds; the Turks having thought fit upon the peace to restore to us a considerable portion of the Countrey about 150 Leagues in compass, which they had usurped upon us, which the Senate is pleased to assign for the maintenance of those of *Candia*, who have chosen rather to loose their Houses and Estates then to live under the Turkish jurisdiction.

Count *Portia* after an extraordinary hazard he ran at sea it here arrived, and General *spaar* suddenly expected with the remaining German forces which served under his Command during the siege of *Candia*, and gave many proofs of their valour, which induces the Emperour and the several Princes of *Germany*, from whom they were sent to desire their return.

Genova, Dec. 4. The last week arrived a ship from *Lisbonne* with Letters of the 10th past, advising us, that they are there sitting up three great ships which may be ready in few weeks to convey a new Viceroy to the *East-Indies*, they having advice of the decease of the old one, and that they had Intelligence of the safe arrival of three of their ships at *Brazille* from the *East Indies* very richly laden, which might be suddenly expected at *Lisbonne* with six other ships which were ready to put to sea from thence laden with Sugars.

Here is lately returned into Port the Gally which was sent to *Naples*, having by the way landed Segnior *Antonio Genaro* at *Civita Vecchia*, but gives us no other advice, but that four Gallies belonging to the Neopolitan Squadron were put into *Porto Longone*.

Two days since was launched here a new Gally, the Republick having ordered the building of four more for the strengthening of their Squadron.

We having had certain Intelligence of the death of the Governour of the Isle of *Corfica*, Yesterday *Carlo Emanuel Durazzo* was made choice of to succeed in that Charge, and may be suddenly dispatched thither to take possession thereof.

We have lately from *Rome* an account of the promotion of *Cardinals*, and the dangerous distemper of the Pope, who has been oppressed with melancholly ever since the fatal news of the surrender of *Candia*, and lately much afflicted with violent fits of the Stone.

He has sent hither to press the speedy departure of the Lady the Heiress of Monseignor *Pallavirino*, being
