being desirous before his death, to see the Marriage solemnized between her and his Nephew, and to this purpose he desires that the Republick would abate of their great preparations for her more honourable transportation, for which they had designed 6 Gallies, with which the State will comply, so that Legnige Francise Adaria Balbi who was designed to have attended her to Rome in the name of this State, is now eased of that emploiment, and only two Gallies sixted up for her Convoy.

A Bark arriving here from Barcellona informs us, that the Duke & Office has non forme diffatisfaction defined to be difmissed from the Charge of his Vice-Royalty, and that the Dake di sessa is daily there expected to succeed

him in that Government.

From Mil n they write that there lately arrived in that City So nior Don Francisco Mangana, keeper of the Jewels to his Cutholick Mejetty, and a principal Member of the Cou cil of Italy, he has received the visits of all the Ministers and persons of Honour of that place, and intenus speedily to depart thence for Germany to Compliment the elder Arch-Dutches, and to make her some considerable Presents from the Queeen Regent of Span.

From Turin we are told that the Duke of savey was returned this her to visit the Duchels who has been lately much indisposed but is again upon recovery, and that the you is Prince has been dangeroully sick but is again restored to a good state of health; and that about 120 solders are daily expected there, being the por remainder of two Regiments which were sent by the Duke for the succor of Candia, and have been destayed in their march homewards, by the Republick of Vinice.

His Majesty has likewise desired the Cardinals de Rotz, Grimaldi, and de Bouillon to repair to Rome to be present at the Election of a new Pope.

We are confidently told that His Majesty has nominated the Biss p of Bessers to succeed in the Archbishoprick of Thoulose lately vacant, whereof he intends to take possession and be installed with the usual Ceremonies on his way for Spain, whither he has for some time been

de figned Amballador.

of the Ports of France.

Monfieur Colbert Captain of the Musqueters, is said to have late y purchased of the Count de Vivesne the Charge of General of His Maj sties Gallies, and the said Count

Paris, Dec. 18. We have no certain news as yet of the death of the Pope, though it be taken for granted, he was it! beyond all hopes of recovery, upon which account the Cardinal de Bouillon and the Duke de Chanines departed on Monday aft with all possible diligence to be preient at the Election of a successor to the Papal Dignity.

From Holland we are informed, that the States are making great preparations to put themselves it a posture of defence, being grown somewhat jealous and apprehensive of the designs and intentions of their neighbours; and that Prince Maurice lately presented them with a Memoriala desiring some Commissioners might be appointed to consult with him about the present state and posture of afsairs.

Tis faid the States are Treating with him for his Houle intending to purchase it for the sum of 60 thousand Dollars, and to fit it up for the Reception and Entertainment

of Ambassadors Extraordinary.

The Turkith Envoy is fallen into a distamper which confines him to his Chamber; the Letter which he delivered to His Majesty does not (as he expected) conserve on him any more honourable Character, not does is contain any thing of moment. besides Compliments from the Grand Segnior, and some exposulations about His most Christian Majesties former intention of recalling the Sieur de 16 Haje His Ambassassian from the Octoman Port.

Weymouth, Dec. 8. The 5th instant artived here a ship of this Port from St. Malees, which informs that His mode. Christian Majesty is sending Eight sail of ships towards

the Eaft-Indies.

The 6th initiant arrived the ship called the Resolution from one Canaries, and the Dorothy of this place from Malaga in 26 days, with a Flect of 25 other Merchang ships and a sufficient Convoy as far as the Soundings 9 the latter informing us of a consident report about those parts, that six men of war of the Turkish Corsairs of Algiers, had off Cape Gast engaged a Convoy of the Fish thip, from Newsgundland, in which the Tanis Merchant sier a stout desence was unfortunately sized, and Cap am Hubers killed, and that six of those Fish-ships became a prey to the Bulmy, the men having first quitted them and put themselves aboard the men of war their Convoy, who after a sharp Combat of Five hours, with the rest of the Fleet, sectured their Retreat into the Bay of Almarea.

Deale, December 11, Yesterday in the morning the Wind coming Northerly invited the Fleet in the 'Downs' consisting of about 60. fayl of Merchant ships to set sayl, but the Wind rising and the seas running high, only the smaller ships went off, and were this morning sollowed by the greater ships with their Convoyes.

London, December 11. This day the Black, Rod was sent from the House of Peers to that of the Commons, to tell them that the Lordon authorised by Commission from His Majesty, desired the attendance of that Honorable House immediately in the House of Peers, who accordingly went thither with their speaker, to whom His Majesties said Commission being read, the Parliament was prorogued till the 14th of February next ensuing.
