NOTICE is hereby given that the County Council of Somerset as highway authority pursuant to Section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, propose to make application to the Magistrates' Court sitting in the Petty Sessional Division of Shepton Mallet at the Court House, Shepton Mallet on the 13th day of March 1962, at 10.30 a.m. for Orders:

- (i) stopping up the part of the highway in the parish of Croscombe described in Part I of the Schedule hereto and diverting the said part so stopped up to the new line coloured brown on the plan hereinafter mentioned;
- (ii) stopping up the part of the highway in the parish of Doultong described in Part II of the Schedule hereto and diverting the said part so stopped up to the new line coloured brown on the said plan;
- (iii) stopping up the footpath or highway in the said parish of Doultong described in Part III of the Schedule hereto and diverting it to the new line coloured blue on the said plan.

*Felixstowe (Maidstone Road Infants School) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961*

*City of Wakefield (Holmfild Lane) Public Path Diversion Order, 1961*
