

MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND FOOD

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named regulations, that he hereby recognises each of the official certificates of which particulars are given in the schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

Where the certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an official certificate; and where the certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container, as the case may be.

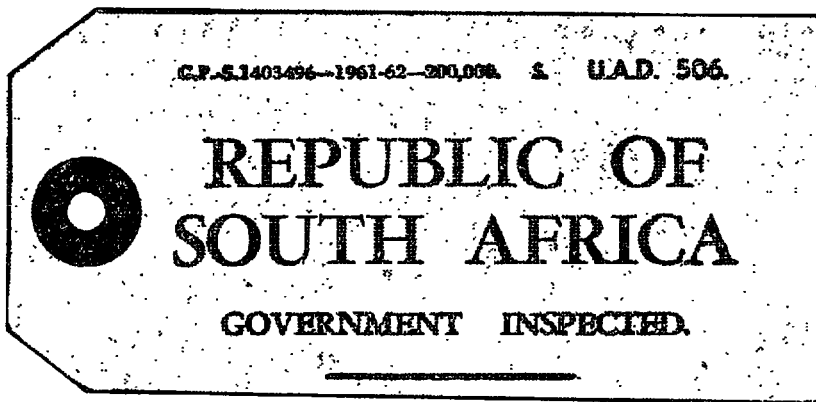
The certificates hereby recognised replace the certificates recognised on 6th August, 1937 and 17th March, 1939, which are hereby revoked.
