

Whereas the Minister of Housing and Local Government, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Helen, Pinxton in the

county of Nottingham, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in that part of the Churchyard of St. Helen in the said Parish shown coloured red on the plan annexed hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 6th day off June next.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of Holy Trinity, New Hythe, in the Civil Parish of East Malling in the County of Kent, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 25th day of January 1962, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853, 16 & 17 Vict. c. 134, and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the

advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

d. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of Holy Trinity, New Hythe in the said Parish.

Provided that-

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of Holy Trinity, New Hythe, East Malling, Kent) Order, 1962.
