HOMICIDE ACT, 1957

An Inquisition indented, taken for our Sovereign Lady the Queen, at H.M. Prison, Bedford, pursuant to the directions of "The Capital Punishment Amendment Act, 1868," on the fourth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, before Max Gershon Levy Lucas, Esquire, Coroner of our said Lady the Queen for the said County of Bedford (North District) on view of the body of James Hanratty now here lying dead at Her Majesty's Prison, Bedford within the Jurisdiction of the said Coroner, upon the oaths of the undersigned Jurors, good and lawful men of the said County of Bedford, who being now here duly chosen, sworn, and charged to enquire, for our said Lady the Queen, when, where, and in what manner, the said James Hanratty came to his death, say upon their oaths that the said James Hanratty was a Prisoner in the said Prison, indicted and convicted for the murder of Michael John Gregsten and sentenced to death for the said offence, after the passing of the said Statute. And that judgment of death was duly executed and carried into effect upon the said offender, for the said offence, on the day and year aforesaid, within the walls of the said Prison in which the said offender was confined at the time of execution. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is now here held, on view of the body of the said offender, by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs, within twenty-four hours after the execution; and that the body of the said James Hanratty now here lying dead, is the identical body of the said offender, who was so convicted and executed for the offence aforesaid. And that the said offender, at the time of his death was a Male person, of the age of twenty-five years, and formerly a Window Cleaner.

In Testimony whereof the said Coroner and Jurors have hereunto set their hands and seals the day, year and place above written.
