REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF SECTION 13 OF THE ARCHITECTS (REGISTRATION) ACT, 1931, AMENDING THE EXISTING REGULATIONS.

Schedule 2

Examinations recognised by the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Architectural Education in accordance with section 6 (3) of the principal Act.

Amend Schedule 2 of the Regulations by the addition of the following words:

addition of the following words:—

"The School of Architecture, University of Melbourne, Victoria, Australia: Degree of Bachelor of Architecture Final Examination, followed by the passing of the examination in Professional Practice and Practical Experience of any one of the Schools of Architecture in the United Kingdom or the Republic of Ireland which is recognised in respect of section 6 (1) (c) of the Principal Act, or of any examination in Professional Practice and Practical Experience which the Council may from time to time recognise for the purpose."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords (Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th June 1962, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £230,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 2nd July 1962, to Saturday, the 7th July 1962, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank

of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through at London Banker, Discount House, or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 nm. (Saturday Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday, 11.30 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
