Notice of submission of Preliminary Draft Regulations entitled The National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Amendment Regulations, 1962.

In accordance with section 77 of the National Insurance Act, 1946, the National Insurance Advisory Committee give notice that they have received from the Minister of Pensions and National Insurance for consideration and report thereon the preliminary draft of regulations entitled the National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Amendment Regulations, 1962.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Regulations substitute for the Schedule to the principal Regulations (which sets out provisions of the Regulations dealing with the collection and recovery of Income Tax under Pay As You Earn as modified to apply for the purpose of graduated contributions) a new Schedule which makes the consequential amendments necessitated by the consolidation in the Income Tax (Employments) Regulations, 1962 of the Income Tax provisions; the Regulations in the Schedule are again not numbered consecutively so that those provisions of the Income Tax (Employments) Regulations, 1962 applied or adapted retain for graduated contributions purposes the numbers which they bear in the latter Regulations. The only amendment of substance is in Regulation 34 in the Schedule, corresponding to a similar provision in the Income Tax (Employments) Regulations, 1962, which clarifies the powers of the Collector of Taxes to certify for recovery purposes, following an inspection of an employer's records, the amounts of graduated contributions unpaid by him.

The Regulations incorporate the additions made to the Schedule, in respect of seamen's graduated contributions, by the National Insurance (Collection of Graduated Contributions) Amendment Regulations, 1961, and those Regulations are accordingly revoked.
