## PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL

*Proposed diversion of Lucy Lane, Stanway*

## WORCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*The County of Worcester (Footpaths Nos. 58 and 60, Kempsey, and Footpath No. 4 Severn Stoke) Extinguishment Order, 1962.*

On the 27th day of June 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish at the expiration of 14 days from the date of confirmation of the Order the public right of way running from the southern end of Normoor Common on the Baynhall to Kerswell Green Road for a distance of 395 yards to the Bristol Birmingham Motorway, the public right of way running from the Baynhall to Kerswell Green Road along the north side of the Green, Kerswell Green, for a distance of 410 yards to the Bristol Birmingham Motorway, and the public right of way running from the Kerswell Green to Croome D'Abitot Road in a north easterly direction across O.S. 175 and over the British Birmingham Motorway for a distance of 530 yards to its junction with the main part of footpath No. 4.
