MERIONETH COUNTY COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Merioneth County Council propose on the 28th day of August 1962 at 10.30 a.m. at the Shire Hall, Dolgellau to apply to the Magistrates' Court for the Petty Sessional Division of Talybont for an Order that part of the Tynygroes—Llanfachreth Class III road in the Parish of Llanelltyd from its junction with the Aberystwyth—Dolgellau—Bangor (Trunk Road No. 81) near Tynygroes Hotel for a distance of 260 yards in a north-easterly direction to a point 20 yards south of Pont Tynygroes be authorised to be stopped up and diverted subject to the reservation of a public footpath over the said part of the said road to a new highway constructed from a point opposite the west side of the said Pont Tynygroes for a distance of 278 yards in a north-westerly direction to its junction with the said Trunk Road No. 81 434 yards north of the said Tynygroes Hotel so as to make the said Class III road to Llanfachreth more commodious to the public.

WORTHING RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Worthing Rural District Council, Part of Public Path, Roundstone By-Pass to Roundstone Lane, Angmering, Diversion Order, 1962

On the 2nd day of July 1962, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert the southern part of a public footpath running from the Roundstone By-Pass, Angmering, in a northerly direction for a distance of 250 feet and thence in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 1400 feet across land held for agricultural and/or horticultural purposes leading to Roundstone Lane, Angmering, to a line from the Roundstone By-Pass, Angmering, in a northerly direction for a distance of 1380 feet and thence in a westerly direction for a distance of 680 feet along the eastern and northern boundaries respectively of the said agricultural and/or horticultural land and thence continuing unaltered to Roundstone Lane, Angmering.

The footpath will be diverted as from the 14th day of August 1962.
