WALTHAMSTOW BOROUGH COUNCIL

Walthamstow (No. 5) Smoke Control Order, 1962

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Walthamstow, acting by the Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 111 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 29th day of June 1962, made an Order entitled the Walthamstow (No. 5) Smoke Control Order, 1962, declaring the area described in the schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 111 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Walthamstow, London E.17, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 27th day of July 1962.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to The Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

An area bounded by:

The eastern boundary of railway (British Railways—Eastern Region—Walthamstow and Chingford Line) from Wadham Bridge in a northerly direction to the centre of Hale End Road.

Centre of Hale End Road to centre of Handsworth Avenue.

Centre of Handsworth Avenue to centre of Church Avenue.

Centre of Church Avenue to rear of properties on south side of Gordon Avenue to centre of Horse Ride.

Centre of Horse Ride and the eastern boundary of Matson Court, The Bridle Path to the eastern end of The Bridle Path thence through the forest in an easterly direction to within approximately 87 yards of the Borough boundary and thence in a south easterly direction to the Borough boundary by Woodford New Road.

Borough boundary in a southerly direction to a point at the rear of Peel Road, Woodford, approximately 140 yards south of the centre of Chelmsford Road, Woodford, and thence across the forest in a north westerly direction to the centre of the North Circular Road approximately 60 yards south east from its junction with Hale End Road.

Centre of North Circular Road to Wadham Bridge.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Halesowen in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 111 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 12th day of July 1962, made the above-mentioned Orders declaring the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be smoke control areas which Orders are about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 111 (4) of the Act, if on any day after the Orders have come into operation, smoke is emitted

from a chimney of any building within the smoke control areas the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Orders will not come into operation before the dates shown in the Schedule hereto or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Orders and of the maps referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Council House, Great Cornbow, Halesowen, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from 21st day of July 1962.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Orders may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Orders.

SCHEDULE

No. 14 (Cradley Fields, Cradley)

That part of the Borough of Halesowen containing an area of 2.57 acres or thereabouts, and bounded on the north by Dencil Close, on the east by the western boundaries of (No. 2) Dencil Close, and of Nos. 94 and 77 Parkside Road, on the south east by the north western boundaries of "Pen-Dinas" and of No. 80 Beecher Road, on the west by Beecher Road and Alma Street, and by the eastern boundary of No. 11 Alma Street, and on the south west and south by the rear boundaries of Nos. 11 and 13 Alma Street and of (Nos. 25-31) Fatherless Barn Crescent. The area includes all properties in Cradley Fields, Nos. 1-9 Alma Street, Nos. 68-72 (evens) and Nos. 17 and 19 Beecher Road, and Nos. 79-85 (odds) Parkside Road, all numbers being inclusive. Operative date 1st March 1963.

No. 15 (Hope Street, Blackheath)

That part of the Borough of Halesowen containing an area of 5.1 acres or thereabouts and bounded on the north west by the footpath running from Olive Lane to the junction of Chapel Street and Malt Mill Lane, on the north east by the rear boundaries of Nos. 1-9 Chapel Street, and of (Nos. 15-81) Olive Hill Road on the south east by the north west boundary of No. 13 Olive Hill Road, and on the south west by the rear boundaries of Nos. 30-81 Olive Lane and on the north eastern boundaries of Nos. 12 and 13 Hope Street. The area includes all the proposed new development off Hope Street. Operative date 1st May 1963.

No. 16 (Cockshed Farm)

That part of the Borough of Halesowen containing an area of 1.5 acres or thereabouts and bounded on the north-east by Cockshed Lane, on the south-east by the northern boundary of No. 150 Olive Lane and the rear boundaries of Nos. 12-20 Meadow Road, on the south west by the field boundary running in a straight line between the rear boundaries of No. 12 Meadow Road and No. 10 Graham Road, and on the north west by the north eastern boundary of the Borough Council's Highway Depot and the rear boundaries of Nos. 5-9 Graham Road. The area includes all the proposed new development off Cockshed Lane. Operative date 1st May 1963.
