## BOSTON BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Borough of Boston (Red Lion Street) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1962*

The Council of the Borough of Boston propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting by vehicles in Red Lion Street on its north-west side from its junction with Tunnard Street to Wornigate and on its south-east side for a distance of thirty yards from its junction with Tunnard Street, except for the purpose of boarding, alighting, loading or unloading and for funerals, building and road works and the maintenance of essential services.

## STOCKPORT COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

On 3rd July 1962, the Stockport County Borough Council made Orders under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effects of which are as follows:

1. *The County Borough of Stockport (Traffic Regulation) (No. 46) Order, 1962*

To prohibit the waiting of vehicles (except for boarding or alighting, loading or unloading, funerals, demolition and building operations, removal of obstructions, or maintenance of highway and public utility services):

- (i) on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., in George's Road on the north-westerly side for a distance of 400 feet and on the south-easterly side for a distance of 393 feet measured from the westerly face line of Wellington Road North, and
- (ii) at all times (a) on the west side of Dialstone Lane between Prestwich Street and Hemphaw Lane; (b) on the south side of Hemphaw Lane between Dialstone Lane and Lowndes Lane; and (c) in Lowndes Lane on the west side for a distance of 300 feet and on the east side for a distance of 96 feet measured from a point 14 feet from the southerly kerb line of Hemphaw Lane.

2. *The County Borough of Stockport (Parking Places) (No. 7) Order, 1962*

To authorise the use as a street parking place of the part of the east side of Lowndes Lane extending from a point 110 feet from the southerly kerb line of Hemphaw Lane for a distance of 160 feet.

3. *The County Borough of Stockport (Traffic Regulation) (No. 47) Order, 1962*

To amend the provision of "The County Borough of Stockport (Traffic Regulation) (No. 8) Order, 1955", which prohibits the waiting of vehicles on the west side of Great Underbank between its junction with Little Underbank and its junction with Bridge Street on even dates for longer than 20

minutes in any hour between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., by removing from the operation thereof of that length of Great Underbank on the side mentioned between Union Road and a point approximately 70 feet in a northerly direction (i.e., along the frontage of the White Lion Hotel).

The Orders referred to at 1 and 2 above will come into operation on 1st August 1962, whilst that referred to at 3 above will come into operation on 27th July 1962.
