

WARWICKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Warwick (Barrow Road, Kenilworth)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1962*

The Warwickshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be that vehicles will be prohibited from waiting, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, on both sides of Barrow Road, Kenilworth, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m., on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive, from its junction with Warwick Road, for a distance of 42 yards in a south-westerly direction.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Objections to the proposal must be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 20th August 1962.

FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Flint (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (Sandycroft Road, Queensferry) (No. 2) Order, 1962

The Flintshire County Council have applied to the Minister of Transport for confirmation of an Order made by them under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to impose a speed limit of 40 m.p.h. on that length of Sandycroft Road (B.5129) which extends from a point 45 yards east of the new roundabout at Queensferry to a point 333 yards north west of Mancot Lane junction, a distance of approximately 225 yards.

(Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1962*

The Flintshire County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on the lengths of High Street, Mold, specified hereunder (except for boarding, alighting, loading and unloading and certain other necessary purposes).

On the south-westerly side, from its junction with Earl Road extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 47 yards.

On the north-easterly side, from its junction with King Street extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 27 yards.

DEVON COUNTY COUNCIL

*The County of Devon (Various Streets, Holsworthy)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1962*

The Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting by vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on weekdays on the following lengths of road in the Urban District of Holsworthy:

North Road—between its junction with Church Lane and a point 20 yards north of that junction.

Fore Street—between Church Lane and Bodmin Street.

Chapel Street—between Bodmin Street and the southern side of the railway bridge.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to permit waiting for boarding or alighting from vehicles; loading or unloading goods; to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage; and for building operations, road maintenance and repairs and other similar works.
