HERTFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (Polzeath) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1962

Lengths of Road at Polzeath in the Parishes of St. Minver Highlands and St. Minver Lowlands

(a) The Wadebridge—Polzeath—Rock Road (Class III):

(i) from the eastern abutment of the bridge over the stream at Polzeath for a distance of 149 yards in a westerly direction;

(ii) from the eastern abutment of the bridge over the stream at Polzeath for a distance of 106 yards in an easterly and north-easterly direction;

(b) The length of unadopted road parallel to and adjoining the south-eastern side of the length of road described in paragraph (ii) above and commencing at a point 44 yards east of the eastern abutment of the aforesaid bridge and extending for a distance of 55 yards in a north-easterly direction.
