NEW TOWNS ACT, 1946

DRAFT ORDER UNDER SECTION 1

The Dawley New Town (Designation) Order, 196

1. Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government in exercise of his powers under section 1 of the New Towns Act, 1946, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, has prepared and is about to consider the draft of an Order designating as the site of a proposed new town an area comprising approximately 10,035 acres of land in the administrative county of Salop situate partly in the urban district of Dawley, partly in the borough of Wenlock, partly in the urban district of Oakengates, partly in the rural district of Shifnal and partly in the rural district of Wellington, which land is shown on the map referred to in the draft Order.

2. In compliance with the provisions of paragraph 2 of Schedule 1 to the Act, a copy of the draft Order and a copy of the map, together with a statement indicating the size and general character of the proposed new town, have been deposited at the following places: Shirehall, Shrewsbury; The Council House, Birmingham; Council Offices, Dawley; Municipal Offices, Wenlock; Council Chambers, Oakengates; Rural District Council Offices, Wellington; Council Chamber, Shifnal; and may be inspected at all reasonable hours.

3. Copies of the draft Order, map and statement have also been deposited at the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, where they may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays, except Saturdays.

4. Copies of the map on the scale of six inches to one mile, on which is shown the area referred to in the above draft Order, may be obtained, price 7s. 6d. per copy or 9s. 4d. post free, from the following agents of the Ordnance Survey:

Copies of an explanatory memorandum which the Minister has had prepared setting out the main considerations which have led him to propose the development under the provisions of the New Towns Act, 1946, of the area referred to in paragraph 1 of this notice may be seen or obtained free of charge on application at the offices given in paragraphs 2 and 3 above.

6. Any objections to the proposed Order must be made in writing and addressed to the Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, on or before the 4th October 1962. The grounds of objection must be stated and, if the objection relates to any specific property, the nature of the objector's interest, if any, in that property should also be stated.

7. In accordance with paragraph 5 of the First Schedule to the Act any person who duly makes an objection may, at the time of making the objection, or afterwards, send to the Minister a request in writing to be served with a notice of the making of the Order. An address for the service of the notice must be specified.

8. The Act provides that, if any objection is duly made to the proposed Order and is not withdrawn, the Minister shall, before making the Order, cause a public local inquiry to be held with respect thereto and shall consider the report of the person by whom the inquiry was held.
