## OPENCAST COAL ACT, 1958

Whereas the National Coal Board has applied to the Minister of Power for an authorisation under Section 1 of the Opencast Coal Act 1958 for the purpose of working coal by opencast operations on land at Penybank in the Rural District of Llandeilo in the County of Carmarthen:

And whereas the Minister in pursuance of Schedule 1, paragraph 7 (3) of the said Act thinks fit to cause a public local inquiry to be held before determining whether to grant the authorisation:

Now therefore notice is hereby given that the Minister has appointed A. M. Roberts, M.A., A.M.T.P.I., Dip.T.P., to hold the said Inquiry at

the Court House, Ammanford, on 2nd October 1962 at 10 a.m. and on subsequent days if necessary. Any person desiring to be heard or represented at the Inquiry should notify such desire on or before 28th September 1962, by letter addressed to the Senior Officer for Wales, Ministry of Power, Gabalfa, Cardiff.

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, 1944 AND 1947

*Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way City of Worcester*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over Lich Street and Newdix Court in the city of Worcester.

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS, 1944 AND 1947

*Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way County Borough of West Ham*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Housing and Local Government, in exercise of powers conferred upon him by section 23 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1944, as incorporated with the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, has prepared in draft and proposes to make an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over Wick Road, Addison Road, Sandford Street, Eldon Road and part of Lansdowne Road, West Ham.
