- (2) to shorten the openative hours of all existing restrictions on the waiting of vehicles in the roads or lengths of roads mentioned in (4) below to 8 a.m.—6.30 p.m. in place of 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.; and to exclude Sundays from all restrictions

restrictions; (3) to prohibit the avaiting of vehicles between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. in the following lengths of road Mondays to Saturdays inclusive: (Brookhill Street, Stapleford—for a distance of 1.50 feet from its junction with Derby Road; (Chilwell Road, Beeston—between Foster Wavenue and Devonshire Avenue; (Chunch Street, Stapleford—between its junc-tion with Nottingban Road and Derby Road and its junction with Pinfold Lane; City Road, Beeston—between its junction with High Road and its junction with Clifton Street; Stoney Street, Beeston—for 70 feet from its junction with High Road (unilateral waiting to be permitted along the remaining length of the street);

street); Toton Lane, Stapleford—for a distance of 40 yards from its junction with Nottingham Road and Derby Road;

Villa Street, Beeston (whole length);

(4) to prohibit the toading and unloading of vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. to 9115 a.m., 112.115 p.m. to 1.45 p.m., and 4.30 p.m. to 5.45 p.m. in the following roads or lengths of roads: Chilwell Road, Beeston (The Square to

Devonshire Avenue) [Church Street, Beeston (Chilwell Road to

Styring Street).

Foster Avenue, Beeston (from Chilwell Road for a distance of 156 feet). (High Road, Beeston (Humber Road to The

Square). Station Road, Beeston (The Square to Queens

Road).

Stoney Street, Beeston. Villa Street, Beeston. Wollaton Road, Beeston (between High Road and Abbey Road).

The Orders will come into force on the 1st November 1962.
